 1. Connections: A Counseling Center Affirming Spirituality and Diversity seeing clients since January. Hired a Business Manager who is taking on many of the responsibilities very capably. Financial situation precarious.
 2. UU Congregational disability certification program is now formally underway with one congregation applying and others in process. I am leading the implementation. Four congregations have applied for official status.
 3. Mental Health is the yearly social justice priority for MPUUC. Led the effort to design this program for the coming year. Had a church book-read of American Psychosis, and a hymn sing at Morton Bakar clinic. More planned for 2016.
- Continue helping care for both grandsons: Nate, age 4 every other Saturday and Zach age 5 months every other Tuesday.
- For the UUMA program in Entrepreneurial Ministry I Attended an outstanding week-long education retreat for Entrepreneurial Ministry in Chicago
