Both books take the form of letters from black parents to their children. Each book is less than 200 pages and they are available in physical book, Kindle, and audio book form from Amazon; Breathe is available in physical book form from the



UUA Book and Gift Shop; and both books are available in audiobook format from **bookshop.org**. Both books are also available in all formats from the Alameda County Library. If you are interested in participating please purchase the books and start reading ASAP. If you need help acquiring the books please let me know.

After the prayer, when the singing of Silent Night starts, light your candle (a small tea saucer and votive candle works nicely). The important thing is for each face to be illuminated in the darkness – symbolizing the light we each bring into one another's lives. Thank you for being part of the service. And the community.
