Greetings!

We are less than six short weeks away from the Installation where you – as the congregation – and I – as the minister – will enter into a covenant of ministry together. The Covenant we have been working on – the MPUUC Covenant Among Members – has been benefitting from all your wise and creative feedback. It has been helping us understand the benefits of having an intentional covenant, how it helps unite us, that we may aspire toward ideals of deep compassion, mutual trust, and a commitment to just and fair relationships.

The Board is hoping that MPUUC members will be ready to vote on adopting it at a special Congregational Meeting on April 18. At that meeting we also hope to vote on a second covenant. The second Covenant is the MPUUC Covenant Between the Minister and the Congregation. Last week, you



may have read what I shared about Why Do We Need Two Covenants? I encourage you to read it again.

I want to tell you what it means to me. I have not been working so hard on this because I have too much time on my hands. I work on these covenants – the 2nd one in particular – because being a minister – and being a minister HERE – is very important to me. So important I want to protect it with the care and guidance of people I respect and trust. The best thing I know about how to keep a promise is to make it with lots of witnesses – people who will help hold that promise in place.

The 2nd Covenant describes the heart of the installation. Indeed, it is the heart of the promise that roots my ministry here. I remember, back in 1999, when I entered my first settled ministry, I was stunned when I realized that the Covenant that the congregation and I would read together during that Act of Installation would be something that I just wrote. And no one in the congregation – not the board, or the Committee on Ministry or anyone – needed to see it beforehand. And that is – by and large – the way it happens in all congregations. I have learned a lot since then and that's why I think it's better – it's stronger – when it is a covenant that is created together.

There is a section following the 2nd Covenant that invites you to share your impressions. Please use this opportunity to share what you think. How could this Covenant help make our shared ministry together as strong as possible? I look forward to hearing your thoughts. Starting on Sunday, March 21, there will be a survey to gather feedback for this covenant as well.

We are Ordaining one of our own!

In the Unitarian Universalist denomination only congregations are able to ordain ministers. The Mission Peak UU board voted in January to jointly ordain Robert Alex Jensen on June 6th, along with the congregation where he is serving as an intern, First Parish in Wayland, MA. Alex grew up in our congregation and is graduating from Harvard Divinity School with a Masters of Divinity degree in May. When he graduates, he will have all of the credentials to practice as a UU minister and was accepted for fellowship by the UUA.

Mission Peak UU is accepting donations to help pay for his ordination costs. An ordination committee with Steve Wallcave, Alex and some members from First Parish in Wayland, MA are planning the ordination. Both congregations are donating to fund the ordination. First Parish donated \$1500 to the ordination fund and Mission Peak UU has donated \$500 from our reserves. 
