Greetings!

Hello, my name is Barbara Meyers and I am a UU Community Minister affiliated with Mission Peak. The focus of my ministry is mental health and I usually speak and act on that subject. But, I have also been deeply involved with the Anti-Racist & Anti-Oppression Education & Action (ARO) Task Force formed last year in response to racism. At February's MPUUC Board Meeting, the ARO Task Force became a standing committee.



My commitment to anti-racism and anti-oppression came after attending many classes, meetings and General Assembly workshops on racism. At the 2016 UUA General Assembly, I finally "got it" that until white people take action, racism in the United States will not be eradicated. And that unless I take some action to counter racism, I am complicit. I've done a lot of reading about racism and joined the local NAACP chapter. When the ARO team was created, I joined it and have engaged in its activities, including taking the Beloved Conversations virtual education program along with 1400 other UUs, three of whom belong to MPUUC.

This coming Sunday's service will be led by the ARO team. We will talk about what motivated our work, what we've done, and what we plan to do. One of our recommendations will be that we adopt the "8th Principle," a proposed new UU principle that addresses anti-racism and anti-oppression. We look forward to educating the congregation about this issue, and getting your input.




### NEW: After-Service Mini Discussion Group!

The next board meeting is on Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 7 p.m.


