SHARE THE PLATE with the Tri-City Urban Forestry Alliance (TUFA)

MPUUC is pleased to welcome the Tri City Urban Forestry Alliance (TUFA) to Share the Plate with us on April 11th. TUFA is a relatively new organization (founded January 2019) advocating for strong, vibrant Urban Forest programs in Fremont and its



neighboring cities under the leadership of Lynn Miller. They have been impacted, as most have, by the COVID19 pandemic. However, as Spring arrives and the pandemic loosens its grip, they are once again starting to plant trees, educate the public, and help make Fremont and the Tri-Cities a place where beautiful, environmentally important trees are restored. They grow trees in a new nursery and are working closely with the City of

Fremont as they develop their Urban Forest Program in the years ahead. They leverage volunteer groups to hold tree planting events, and have a close relationship with the Tri-City Ecology Club, a well-respected environmental group that has served the Tri-City area for over 40 years.

If you have not been contacted by your "connector" to schedule a 1-on-1 conversation, please let me know. We are winding up our yearly pledge drive, or Canvass, where we make a pledge for our upcoming fiscal year which starts July 1, 2021, and ends June 30, 2022. We had hoped to have all our connections complete and pledges turned in by April 4, but there are many members who have not yet participated. These conversations are a great way to reconnect with



someone you may not have talked with recently, and to share your hopes for how we can make Mission Peak a bigger and better force for positive change in the world! We want to hear from you, even if you are unable to pledge this year. If you have connected, please remember to fill out your pledge form online.

So far we have seen amazing generosity from the Mission Peak community! We have currently received about 60% of our expected pledges and we are getting close to our \$220K pledge goal! . But the best news of all is that of the first 37 pledges turned in, 24 increased their pledge by 10% or more to qualify for our generous matching grant. That is truly amazing!! We also know that different families have different circumstances. Some are not able to increase and there is no shame in that.

But those who can increase make sure that we, collectively, are providing resiliency and resourcefulness for our community. We are so grateful and fortunate - AND we really need to continue making those connections and get the remaining pledges. Please make your pledge soon so our leaders can start planning for the coming year.

Letter Writing to NoDAPL Political Prisoners

Tuesday, April 6 at 4 PT / 5 MT / 6 CT / 7 ET

Join the Unitarian Universalist Association, UU Ministry For Earth, UU Service Committee and Love Resists for a letter writing campaign to show solidarity with <u>Steve Martinez</u>, a NoDAPL political prisoner who has been recently incarcerated after refusing to face a grand jury for a second time. Steve, an Indigenous water protector, was first subpoenaed to a federal grand jury in 2017 for his participation in the NoDAPL resistance movement and refused to comply then as now. On the call, hear from Water Protectors and UU organizers about Steve's current legal situation, and write your own letter to Steve and other NoDAPL political prisoners.

Approved combining our 3 Councils into a single Council until that time when more Councils would enhance our operation.


Planned for April Super Council meeting.


Approved congregational meeting on Sunday, April 18 to vote on the Congregational Covenant and the Minister/Congregation Covenant.
