

Greetings!

I have a confession to make: I'm not very good at letting go of things I've loved. I noticed at a very early age that when I finally realize that something or someone I've loved deeply isn't coming back – that it's not going to be part of my life any more – I don't handle it well. My thoughts swirl. My throat constricts. My chest gets tight trying to hold a panicky sadness inside me trying desperately to get out. It's, unfortunately, happened enough times that I've gotten familiar with those moments. And I've dared to let them teach me a few things.

For about 25 years, I've turned to mindful meditation – mostly to work on my struggles with attachment. Moments of loss – especially when people I love die – I realize that it doesn't matter how much meditation I practice – the physical and emotional pain of losing something still hurts. I know, heartbreak is real.



But if there is something else I know, it's how important it becomes to accept the pain instead of resist it. And, for me (your mileage may vary), part of accepting has become sharing.

I come from a long line of stoics. My family line has perfected the withdraw and suffer alone strategy. But, having tried this for a long time, I can say that healing tends to happen more fully – and more quickly – when I dare to share my sense of loss and grief. And part of the practice I've found that helps most is to speak the name of what I've lost out loud.

Several spiritual communities include cultures that speak the names of those we have lost. Part of it honors the dead. But another part honors the time and space that those important people took up residence in us. This Sunday we will have a special service called, the Tolling of the Bells. We will say the names of those who we've lost. We invite you to honor those who've open your mind or expanded your heart by having their name shared. A bell will be rung to carry their name into the world. If you would like to have a

It is important to set aside time to remember and honor the important figures who have died in service of the world. We will take time to recognize and remember those from MPUUC who we've lost, those in the greater UU World, those in the world at large and all those who've been taken by the tragedy of this pandemic.

This Sunday Rev. Greg and Rev. Barbara will present, 'Tolling of the Bells' – a service to name and honor those who have passed in the previous years. We will recognize those who have died from Covid, those who have died from Violence, Those in the UU World (including Mission Peak UU) who've died as well as those in your personal family who've died. If your family has lost someone in the past year, we will include them in the names we read if you let us know by adding their name to the LIST OF LOVED ONES WHO'VE DIED IN THE PAST YEAR.

Rev. Greg Ward will lead the service and assisting will be Worship Associate Rev. Barbara F. Meyers. Worship Host will be Graham Bell. Jay and Jessica Steele will provide our music.

We have started to use Cole Hall again!

Our Worship Hosting Team has been working extraordinarily hard to facilitate the return to Cole Hall. Because Covid has taught us to 'stream' and extend ourselves outward to the larger world, we have reconnected with those who moved away. We have committed ourselves to remaining connected by practicing a 'hybrid' approach to simultaneously presenting service for a live audience AND streaming all over the globe.

Over the summer we plan on having 3 types of services:

- The worship team will be streaming from Cole Hall from Sunday, May 30 to June 13th.
- 2. On June 20th we will be having a service with congregants in Cole Hall. Currently we will be limiting the number of people in Cole Hall to 25. There will be overflow seating on the patio, where people can watch the service through the windows and listen to it over the outdoor speakers. (The rules about the number of people allowed in Cole Hall may change before then.)
- 3. If enough people volunteer to help in Cole Hall (see Sunday Service Team article for details) we will be having live services or watching the Zoom service in Cole Hall after June 20th. (If we do not have enough volunteers, we will be having Zoom only services many weeks)

Each week This Week on the Peak will inform us what type of service is planned for the upcoming service. We will also give details on **mpuuc.org/zoom**.

All service types will be streamed over Zoom as well as any components

in Cole Hall.
