Greetings!

Hello and Happy New Year! My name is Allysson McDonald, and I am a member of the board. You've heard me say that for the last few years, and it is still true, however my role was changed last fall. At our October meeting the board designated me as "on special assignment" for the remainder of the congregational year. I have been excused from attending Executive Team meetings and Board meetings in order to work with Rev. Greg and possibly other volunteers with the goal of reorganizing and rejuvenating Mission Peak UU's Small Group Ministry program.

Why? SMG provides vital community to our members, and also provides an entry point other than Sunday Services for people who might be interested in what we have to offer.



According to the **Small Group Ministry Network**, *Small Group Ministry* is intentional layled small groups that deepen and expand the ministry of a congregation. "*Small*" means a group with a *maximum* of 8-10 people, including facilitator. Groups of this size provide an opportunity to relate on a more intentional level. "*Group*" is a gathering of individuals, sometimes selected at random, sometimes selected for a specific interest or characteristic, that meet over a period of time. "*Ministry*" is the process or act of caring or being present with another. This relates to the spiritual as well as the physical and emotional well-being of the group participants.

They say that the *power and promise of SGM* are Intimacy, Ultimacy and Growth. *Intimacy* is the increased depth of relationship that comes from meeting over time, the willingness and ability to *listen* without comment or advice, to *learn* from others, and to *share* from the soul, beyond the surface. *Ultimacy* focuses on meaning and significance, rather than details, information or outcome. *Growth:* Small Group Ministry provides opportunities to grow leaders and the potential to grow churches in numbers, and in generosity, cooperation, and sense of well-being. This growth occurs when people are connected.

These are the reasons I volunteered to work on revitilizing our Small Group Ministry program this year. We currently have two ongoing groups - a women's group whose point person is Beth Schaefer, and a men's group whose point person is Ty White. My goal is to

get at least one more group started this year. Are you someone who would like to participate? Are you someone who would like to be trained to facilitate a new group? If so, please contact me ASAP!



Updated Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Because of the large surge from Omicron, attending in-person services at Cole Hall is an inherently risky activity, both for the attendees and for the people they have contact with throughout the week. If you are OK with that risk we welcome you. We are blessed to be able to offer an excellent virtual worship experience, and encourage anyone concerned about COVID-19 risk to take advantage of that.

We provide three ways to attend the service — via Zoom, sitting inside Cole Hall, or sitting on the patio outside Cole Hall. Our worship leaders will either be inside Cole Hall or use Zoom to connect to the service in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 (or equivalent) or surgical masks which are more effective than cloth masks. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if recently vaccinated or boosted. Because it is apparent that vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

Where to get Masks:

Cloth masks offer significantly less protection than surgical, N95, and KN95 masks. Now that these masks are widely available, the Covid-19 response team strongly recommends acquiring and using masks with higher levels of protection. Below are two sources of quality masks:

Positive test result for attendee of January 2nd service

We have been informed that someone who attended the January 2nd service in person has tested positive for Covid-19. At the time they attended, they were not experiencing any symptoms. By Tuesday 1/4 they had some mild throat irritation and tested positive.

If you attended the January 2nd service in person also, we encourage you to get tested for Covid-19, ESPECIALLY if you are experiencing symptoms of a head cold, having a fever, or are feeling ill in any way. Even if you are not feeling ill, taking a test could help prevent any further spread by informing you of an asymptomatic infection.

If you do test positive, please advise the Covid-19 Response Task force (DeAnna Alm, Steve Wallcave and Eric Ryan), as we will take it into consideration as we all do our best to help keep our Mission Peak UU families safe.

is passion for a greener and better world. The program provides the support and coaching


needed to reduce emissions, save water and money, and make our community more resilient. This would take about one hour a week from February through June to make a significant impact on climate change.
