30 Days of Love is our Side With Love campaign's annual celebration that runs approximately from Martin Luther King, Jr. Day in January through Valentine's Day in February. It is taken as an opportunity to collectively nurture our spirits, deepen our understanding, and take action on our values for collective liberation. The celebration this year concluded with Side With Love Sunday. This is a worship service featuring stirring music, deep-hearted reflection, and moving testimonies from a range of UU leaders including President, Susan Frederick Gray.

Various UU Leaders will lead the service and assisting will be Worship Associates Revs. Greg Ward and Barbara Meyers. Worship Host will be Graham Bell. Rev. J.Q. Henry will provide our music.

Share the Plate! Funding Drive for Safe Parking Vehicles Fund (There is still time to donate)

Our Courageous Love Hero - Fremont for Everyone - doesn't have non-profit status, so their leadership team selected the Fremont Safe Parking Vehicles Fund as the recipient of our monetary donation. The Fremont <u>Safe Parking</u>



<u>Host Site Pilot Program</u>, launched on January 31, 2022, is designed as a safe, transitional space for individuals living in their vehicle. It's a rotational model, with four faith-based organizations across the city hosting individuals or couples on their site for one

month before rotating to the next site. Volunteers staff the check-in and check-out process in the evenings and mornings, fostering a community for our unsheltered neighbors. The pilot program currently has capacity for 15 passenger vehicles. **The Safe Parking Vehicles Fund**, run by the City of Fremont, helps individuals living in vehicles with the means to repair their vehicles, pay for registration, smog check, etc. This allows car dwellers to go to work, look for housing, and to participate in the Fremont Safe Parking program.

Masking Continues at Cole Hall



In order to maintain the safety of all our members, Mission Peak UU is continuing to require masking inside and outside Cole Hall during services. While Alameda County Health is allowing some public places to stop requiring masks as of February 16th, places that serve more vulnerable populations (like hospitals and schools) are still mandated to mask, and we are following that example.

Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 (or equivalent) or surgical masks which are more effective than cloth masks. We have such masks available in Cole Hall on Sunday mornings. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if fully vaccinated and boosted. Because vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

The board Safety Policy on how we allow services in Cole Hall is in the "About-

<u>>Congregational Documents</u>" section of the mpuuc.org web site. If you wonder how we are trying to keep us all safe as we gather together again, please read it. We expect to continue to monitor what is safe and make changes as needed.

We also have other board policies related to Covid-19 in section 18 of the board policies document, which is also in the "About->Congregational Documents" section of the website. The outdoor event guidelines in section 18.2 will control how we would be able to have food or drinks outside after the service, or for special events. A Multi-Platform Banner Parade!

The Banner Parade is a GA institution, and this year the tradition will be reimagined for a multi-platform audience. Banners will be displayed in the General Session Hall and the celebration will be live streamed. This year, participants will be dropping off their banners before the Opening Celebration begins. Volunteers will be able to decorate the hall before the celebration, allowing attendees to enjoy the event without having to wait in line for a processional.

Please bring your congregation's banner to General Assembly in Portland, Oregon, or submit a high-resolution photo of your congregation's banner by Friday, April 29.

Registration is now open for in-person attendance. Full-time registration is \$475 for adults, and \$250 for high school youth, emerging adults, and retired and candidate ministers. Financial support for registration, lodging credit within the GA housing block, as well as a payment plan are available. In-person registration rates will increase on March 1 and again on May 1. Registration for virtual participation will open March 1.
