Greetings!

My name is Melissa Holmes (pronouns – she, her, hers) and I am on the Board currently serving my third term as Treasurer. The Treasurer works closely with Sandra Lange, our Office Administrator to make sure that the staff gets paid, all the bills are paid, and that reimbursements are paid out to people in the Congregation. I also take care of things like converting stock pledge donations into cash (if you want to pay your pledge using stock or just donate stock to Mission Peak please talk to me). I also help to create the yearly proposed Congregational budget that the Board presents at the annual Congregational meeting.



Right now it's Canvass season, when we all make a pledge to say what our financial contribution to Mission Peak will be for the next fiscal year (July 2022-June 2023). This is very important to the financial health of the Congregation, without your pledge we would not be able to budget for our expenses in the coming year. If you plan to make a donation to Mission Peak next year, it's important that you take the next step and submit your pledge so we know how much you will be donating. We need that information so we can formulate a responsible budget based on our expected income.

During the budgeting process is when we look at whether we can add new expenses to our budget. For example, last year the ARO Committee requested that \$2000 be included in the current budget for Indigenous and African American reparations, which we were able to do. We gave \$1000 to the Community Housing Development Corporation of Virginia, which is a group providing home ownership and wealth building assistance for African Americans in the Bay Area. If you attended the service this past Sunday, you heard Rev. Barbara Meyers read a letter from a recipient of the money we donated, who thanked us for providing the opportunity for their family to buy a house and start the wealth-building process that has been denied to them in the past. I was so grateful and proud that Mission Peak was able turn our values into action and make a difference in the fight against systematic racism in this country. The pledges of our members and friends

made that donation possible.

Money and financial planning are ways that we can turn our values into action. One way that you can help us plan and make the most of our financial resources is to make a pledge to Mission Peak during Canvass. If you have not signed up to attend a pledge party there are a couple left on the schedule, please see the information in the Week on the Peak below to sign up. If you are interested in helping with the financial life of Mission Peak there are other ways you can help as well. For example, we currently don't have a formal way for people to include Mission Peak in their estate planning, which would be a very beneficial program for us. Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 (or equivalent) or surgical masks which are more effective than cloth masks. We have such masks available in Cole Hall on Sunday mornings. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if fully vaccinated and boosted. Because vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

If you wonder how we are trying to keep us all safe as we gather together again, please read it. We expect to continue to monitor what is safe and make changes as needed.

JUBILEE 3 anti-racist anti-oppression training.

Hello UU Communities in the western part of the country,

I am inviting you to consider participating in the Jubilee Three Workshop on the weekend of March 25-27, 2022. Jubilee Three is an antiracism workshop that we have been providing since our congregations shifted to virtual programming. Since September 2020, over 500 UUs have gone through the training.

We are offering Jubilee Three for people who live in or near the Pacific Time Zone to make the schedule more convenient. This training does not require prior courses.

What the Jubilee Three training offers people, of course, depends on where they are in their own life and in their relationships. In the amount of time we have, we cannot cover everything.

We will address:

- how racism was constructed in the U.S.
- how it works systemically in this country.
- the intersection of racism and classism
- the intersection of racism and gender
- how we have all been socialized into systems and a culture historically built from white supremacy, a theme that runs through the training

Multi-Platform General Assembly: Choose Your Platform

In-person Registration is required for all live GA events and programming taking place in Portland, Oregon. In-person registration includes access to virtual content available on the GA app, powered by Whova. In-person registration is the same process for delegates and non-delegates; delegates may register before or after determining their delegate status. General Assembly registration is required for all in-person participants, including in-person delegates. [Register now!](#)

Full Virtual Registration is required for access to virtual GA programming, including workshops, worship services, the Ware Lecture, featured speakers, Opening and Closing celebrations, exhibits, entertainment, and networking. Virtual GA programming will be streamed on the GA app, powered by Whova. Delegates will use the GA Delegate Platform for discussion and voting during General Sessions. Virtual registration is the same process for delegates and non-delegates; delegates may register before or after determining their delegate status. [Register starting March 1](#)

Business-only Virtual Registration provides access to the GA Delegate Platform for discussion and voting during General Sessions. Payment is not required but a donation to offset production and platform costs is suggested. Business-only registrants will access to delegate chat rooms but will not have access to GA programming, the GA app, networking opportunities, or the exhibit hall.
