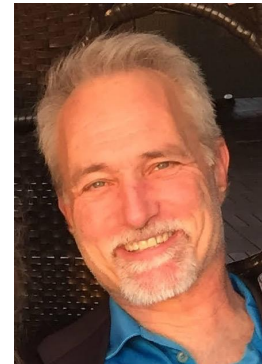

Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 (or equivalent) which are more effective than cloth or surgical masks. We have such masks available in Cole Hall on Sunday mornings. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if fully vaccinated and boosted. Because vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

If you wonder how we are trying to keep us all safe as we gather together again, please read it. We expect to continue to monitor what is safe and make changes as needed.

The outdoor event guidelines in section 18.2 will control how we would be able to have food or drinks outside after the service, or for special events. The January 6 hearings have portrayed the political, legal, and violent attacks on our democracy. As we saw in 2020, a bipartisan group of senators is working to correct flaws in the Electoral Count Act (ECA) to thwart future legal attacks. This revised act would update, tighten and clarify the ECA of 1887, which guides the casting and counting of electoral votes for the presidency, including the role of Congress and the vice president. The revised act must move

forward quickly. Please join with Unitarian Universalists for Social Justice in underscoring for the Senate that the right to vote is fundamental to our democracy, and we need to be confident in our election results. Please fix the Electoral Count Act now!

With poor prospects for major legislation after the [devastating dereliction of duty](#) earlier in January, the DAT has been working on the [Electoral Count Act](#). Yet these public hearings would seem to represent the best chance to apply public pressure, reset the landscape of expectations on [voting rights](#) and free elections, and motivate Congress towards action.
