Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 masks (or equivalent) which are more effective than cloth or surgical masks. We have such masks available in Cole Hall on Sunday mornings. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if fully vaccinated and boosted. Because vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in

contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

If you wonder how we are trying to keep us all safe as we gather together again, please read it. We expect to continue to monitor what is safe and make changes as needed.

The outdoor event guidelines in section 18.2 will control how we would be able to have food or drinks outside after the service, or for special events. Say Yes To A Humane Asylum System!

Prevent Use Of The Pandemic To Codify Title 42

To confront this hypocrisy and restore asylum, UUs are teaming up in solidarity with other faith advocates for a 2-week series of call-in days from July 18-31, 2022.

We are joining our partners to call members of Congress and urge them to oppose any and all Title 42/anti-asylum amendments, and keep them from passing any piece of legislation or provisions through the appropriations process.

Some of the deadliest mass shootings in America have one thing in common: The shooter used an AR-15-style weapon. Assault weapons are the weapon of choice for mass shooters in America because they are uniquely lethal, designed to kill as many people as possible, as quickly as possible.

Banning assault weapons saves lives. During the federal ban from 1994-2004, Americans saw a 37% decline in gun massacres and a 70% decline in assault weapons traced to crimes. Congress let the ban expire in 2004, due to NRA influence, and mass shooting deaths have increased by 347%!

U.S. House Bill HR 1808 would ban assault weapons and high-capacity magazines.

We only need six more representatives to cosponsor it. Let's ban these weapons NOW!
