Hi everyone,

I'm Colleen Arnold (she/her/they) and I'm a member of the board this year.

You may not be aware that in our larger Unitarian Universalist denomination, a task force is looking at revisions to Article II in the UUA bylaws.

Why does this matter? **Article II** lays out our 7 Principles (sing along: "One, each person is worthwhile, Two, be kind in all you do...") and our 6 Sources. It's the bedrock for our faith, and these principles and sources guide our priorities and our actions.



The task force has released a draft of their proposed changes. I urge you to read it and consider what the changes might mean, both personally and for our faith tradition as a whole. This new draft suggests removing the 7 Principles, and replacing them with a different list of values and simplifies our Sources to: "the full depth and breadth of sacred understandings, as experienced by humanity."

The new draft is shorter and easier to read, but our ARO team has looked at this issue carefully, and believes that the new draft may be too general to be useful, and that we've lost a lot of important information with the revision. They have, with the support of the board, written an excellent letter to the task force expressing their concerns and making suggestions for more specific wording that could be used. One of the co-chairs of the task force, Bob Spirko, responded with appreciation for their work, and let us know that a new draft will be coming that may be more along the lines of what our ARO team is suggesting.

Samhain - Connecting to the Spirit of Our Ancestors

For the Celts, who lived during the Iron Age in what is now Ireland, Scotland, the U.K., Samhain (meaning literally, in modern Irish, "summer's end") marked the turning point in the year. Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 masks (or equivalent) which are more effective than cloth or surgical masks. We have such masks available in Cole Hall on Sunday mornings. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if fully vaccinated and boosted. Because vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

The board Safety Policy on how we allow services in Cole Hall is in the "AboutCongregational Documents" section of the mpuuc.org web site. If you wonder how we are trying to keep us all safe as we gather together again, please read it. We expect to continue to monitor what is safe and make changes as needed.

We also have other board policies related to Covid-19 in section 18 of the board policies document, which is also in the "About->Congregational Documents" section of the website. The outdoor event guidelines in section 18.2 will control how we would be able to have food or drinks outside after the service, or for special events. UUs have made the democratic process a cornerstone of the values underpinning our faith. Taking action for the democratic process should be as natural as drawing a breath of air

Election Day – Nov. 8, 2022, brings our democratic process to the forefront of what our society will become and how our Beloved Community will be in it. There are many things you can do, some without leaving the safety of your personal space. Everyone has a seat at this table!

In California we are fortunate to live in a state where the voting process is open and available. Voters can register even at the polls on Election Day, but why wait?

Registering to vote is the first step in taking part in the democratic process. YOU can help others to register – promote **VOTE411.org** – a tool created by the League of Women Voters to help educate everyone about getting registered to vote. https://www.vote411.org

If you — or a friend/loved one - you want to help doesn't live locally, there are more nonpartisan online tools to help. All you need is an address to search. **VOTERS EDGE.org** is another effort by the League of Women Voters —put www.votersedge.org in your search window to get the tool. With an address entered, Voters Edge gives you a copy of the specific ballot, the candidates, issues, information about the candidates and

issues, and who funds them.

UUs began organizing nationwide voting actions with the 2016 election -with UUtheVote. If you can help with a phonebank, or texting- then UUtheVote is the place to go. If you don't have a local effort to partner with, join www.uutheVote.org to support democracy now. MPUUC members have been writing letter/postcards to Voters for years- join us Friday October 28, 11:00 at Mission Coffee Roasting Co., 151 Washington Blvd. Fremont 94539.

Once you are registered to vote then- VOTE! Make a plan *now* to GET YOUR BALLOT COUNTED – and help someone else while you are at it. In California, you got a ballot in the mail. Drop it in the mail, a Drop Box, vote at an Early Voting location, and at your local location marked on your Ballot on Election Day, Nov. 8, 2022.

Be an Advocate with ALL YOUR FRIENDS and FAMILY to Vote, to promote voting rights legislation, to become Poll Workers, and to support organizations that defend democracy. www.UUtheVote.org has a list of partner organizations all over the country.

Join SURJ Bay Area as we phone bank with New Georgia Project (NGP) every Saturday until Election Day. This is a huge election year, and NGP is aiming to phone thousands to get out the vote. In NGP's phone bank Zoom room you'll get all the training and support you need to reach Black, Brown, young, LGBTQ+, rural Georgians, and others who have the power to move the state forward. You'll help folks make their plans to vote and support them in navigating voting rights barriers. This is a great opportunity to increase your 1:1 skills in community, be with other SURJ Bay Area members, and learn what communities of color are facing in the South. Register to join us on one or multiple Saturdays before the election. (Weeknight shifts are also available; all times on the sign-up page are Eastern time).

Board Briefs

Board briefs from October 2022 meeting.

The board met on Tuesday, October 11, 2022.

- Approved purchase of air filters for Cole Hall as a portion of the very generous donation by Maggie Mulcahy in memory of her husband, Jack
 - Mulcahy. These filters will enable us to close the doors during cold weather. We are so grateful to Maggie for enabling this purchase! (The final decision on whether to keep the filters will be subject to noise levels -- we're testing them now.)
- Approved spending \$200 not in budget for Quickbooks support as part of the financial transition to new software.
- Approved September minutes and attachments as written, to be posted on website.
- Noted the previous email approval correcting omission of a line item of sabbatical funding in the Charters for Restricted Funds that had been previously approved.
- Approved the letter from MPUUC's Anti Racism Anti Oppression Committee (ARO) commenting on the UUA's Article 2 proposal. The letter was sent from ARO and the Board to the UUA's Article 2 Commission. The Board recommends to ARO to have a congregational conversation to update/explore this topic.
- Agreed to move the November board meeting from the regularly scheduled date of November 8 (Election Day) to Tuesday, November 15.
- As Christmas Day is on Sunday this year, the Board voted not to have Sunday service the morning after our Christmas Eve Service. Instead, for those who wish it, there will be a small Zoom gathering on December 25 to share some Christmas cheer. If you are interested, please send an email to Rev. Greg (minister@mpuuc.org).
- Voted to approve the transfer of signature authority at SRI Credit Union from previous board members to the current MPUUC Treasurer (Terri King), President (Suzette Takei), and Secretary (Gayle Tupper).
- Received update on the financial process transition. We believe the transition is the right thing to do. It will take longer than expected, and we may be asking for assistance.
- Continued work on updating board policies to concur with MPUUC's bylaw changes.

Due to the timing of the 2022 midterm elections, the Board meeting is moving from November 8th to November 15th. It will be held via Zoom from 6:30-9:30 PM.
