Dear Sandra,

I am Kathi Bayne. I joined Mission Peak Congregation almost 5 years ago. As a member of Anti-racism and Anti-oppression group (ARO), I have been privileged to help search for deserving organizations to share our plate with as well as award MPUUC's gifts of reparative justice.

We have sought out Indigenous organizations that are buying back or preserving their lands. With this in mind, last year, MPUUC contributed to Sogorea Te', an Indigenous Land trust in the Oakland area.



This year, we would like to introduce the Amah Mutsun Tribe and Land Trust to our congregation.

The Amah Mutsun people have lived for thousands of years on the sacred land they call Juristac. It is located in Gilroy, Santa Clara County and is the heart of their spirituality, culture, and sacred ceremonies.

This land is now called Sargent Ranch. It was bought by an investor group from San Diego at a bankruptcy auction. The company is seeking approval from Santa Clara County to develop a 400 acre open pit sand and gravel mine that would cut into the Gilroy hillside, devastating the land.

An environmental review process study for the mining project reveals that tribal cultural resources would be unavoidably destroyed. It states, "Aggregate processing would require over 80,000 gallons of water per day to be pumped from the ground. The erosion and runoff from the mining operations, roads, and waste piles could contaminate both Sargent and Tar Creeks, which flow to the Pajaro River, an already heavily impaired watershed." This desecration of the Hillside of Gilroy would be a tragedy for the Amah Mutsun and for the entire Bay Area community.

Numerous lay and religious groups are supporting the Amah Mutsun in their struggle to preserve Juristac, including the First Unitarian Church of San Jose, Starr King UU Church in Hayward, CA, and the UU Justice Ministry of California.

Please join us this Sunday in sharing our plate with the Amah Mutsun Land Trust

with funds earmarked for Juristac.

Safety Policy for Hybrid Services in Cole Hall

Attendees should be masked inside and outside of Cole Hall during the service. We encourage people to wear N95 masks (or equivalent) which are more effective than cloth or surgical masks. We have such masks available in Cole Hall on Sunday mornings. We encourage people to only come inside Cole Hall if fully vaccinated and boosted. Because vaccinated people can still spread the disease to others, we strongly encourage those in contact with unvaccinated or immunocompromised people to attend services outside or via Zoom.

The board Safety Policy on how we allow services in Cole Hall is in the "AboutCongregational Documents" section of the mpuuc.org web site. If you wonder how we are trying to keep us all safe as we gather together again, please read it. We expect to continue to monitor what is safe and make changes as needed.

We also have other board policies related to Covid-19 in section 18 of the board policies document, which is also in the "About->Congregational Documents" section of the website. The outdoor event guidelines in section 18.2 will control how we would be able to have food or drinks outside after the service, or for special events. Board briefs from September 2022 meeting.

The board met on Tuesday, September 13, 2022.

- Discussed having snacks available after the Sunday services. This will depend on availability of on-site volunteers.
- Recognized the tremendous amount and great quality of work our Zoom hosts do to produce a hybrid service every Sunday. These hosts are Steve Wallcave, Graham Bell, Erik Alm, and David Gibbons, with additional support from Melissa Holmes and Jo Ann Schriner. This is a huge job, and the board thanks each of them.
- Expressed gratitude for Office Administrator Sandra Lange for the excellent work she does—it's a lot, and is a much better way to manage MPUUC's finances.
- Voted to approve the charter for restricted funds as written.



- Noted that the September 11 congregational meeting provided good input about upcoming boutique, raffle, and auction.
- Discussed how to best use the generous gift from Maggie Mulcahy. Ideas include air filters for Cole Hall to enable closing doors during cold weather and other special projects. More information is being obtained and decisions will be made in October.
- Voted to approve \$100 expenditure for Sunday Services aesthetics, and to have a Share the Plate collection in January for aesthetics.
- Voted to apply for an internship scholarship.


