

Dear Mission Peak Community:

I'm happy to join Mission Peak as the new choir director of the Peak Performers. I'm grateful to the work done by Shauna Pickett-Gordon, and the warm welcome I've already received from the members of the choir. You've already heard my voice join the choir in March and April, and I look forward to working with the choir to provide music that elevates the experience of everyone who attends any sort of service here. There is a depth and diversity of musical expression at Mission Peak, and I'm happy to be a part of that community.



As many of you may have questions, a little background on me: I was raised in a very musical family in Pocatello, Idaho. I have three younger brothers and a younger sister, and each of us in my family sings, plays piano, and most of my siblings learned another instrument. Music, singing, and choirs were a large part of my upbringing, so it wasn't a great surprise when I pursued music as a career, starting at Idaho State University. After my undergraduate studies, I moved to the Boston area to pursue a Master's degree, and stayed in the area after graduation from the Longy School of Music. I've sung in a variety of settings, including liturgical, ensemble, musical theater, and opera. I moved to the Bay Area in 2018 with my husband and shiba inu when the former was hired by a large tech company. I have experience as a music director and as a singer, and currently am soprano section leader at an Episcopal church in Portola Valley, as well as a core member of Clerestory, an a cappella ensemble here in the Bay Area. I also teach with the Community School of Music and Arts in Mountain View, which is where I met Drew Wilson, who made me aware that Mission Peak was looking for a choir director.

I was happy to discover during the interview process that the committee asked excellent questions that pointed towards a sincere interest in helping all of the music at Mission Peak to thrive, and in the well-being of the choir and of the choir director. As the choir still meets remotely and assembles our final product from member submissions, I am already in debt to everyone who records, submits, and joins rehearsals to make a joyful sound.


