Dear MPUUC Congregants,

I'm writing to share the state of the congregation with you and ask that each of you look into your heart and determine how vital MPUUC is to you. As I write this letter, the board and LDC have successfully recruited and received "yeses" from several members to step into new roles, either board positions or committees. However, we do not have a President for 2023-24. We need to get every congregation member to energize MPUUC so that we can grow spiritually, mentally, and in community. While we need a President to provide oversight and steering of the ship, we need each member to show up to events, host & participate in day to day efforts, and outreach to the community. A little effort from many, not only makes the



workload lighter, but has dramatic long-term positive effects.

As I imagine the future of MPUUC in 2023-24, I feel optimistic. We have invested in a new RE Coordinator, Ariel, and a new Choir Director, Von, both of whom have an abundance of experience, energy, and enthusiasm that can project us forward into a lively robust community. Our Canvass pledge drive was successful. Many members maintained or increased their pledges. Unfortunately, it was insufficient to counter our inability to add new members and make up for some predictable attrition. I'm ever so grateful for the matching funds and the extra donations received earlier this year, as those above and beyond gifts allowed our budget to be "almost" balanced (our proposed deficit is less than 3% of our budget).

As MPUUC moves forward, we need to be mindful of the importance of outreach and member growth to sustain our vitality, and we must actively participate in the operational needs of our beloved community. We cannot grow in the future without more present members volunterring and helping out. Many members are wearing multiple hats, and I worry we will wear them out to the point of no return.

As president, I was not overwhelmed. I found the job manageable and painless. I actually enjoyed the board and executive meetings for the fellowship and responsible conversations that allowed me to grow and stretch. I made friends and

learned about myself and how leadership can be shared responsibly and respectfully. MPUUC has stretched, encouraged, and left me with more confidence and understanding of how socially just actions and discussions create positive change. This will forever be with me.

Why did I write this letter?

To ask you to lean into this community to help our congregation grow. That means someone needs to volunteer to be President, many people need to volunteer to join a committee, and everyone needs to find an MPUUC event they can participate in for their personal growth.

If you are willing to open up and lean in, please email or call me. I'd love to talk with you and help you find the best place to volunteer.



JUSTICE CORNER

Two Steps For Immigration Justice: For Asylum, For Afghans & Vets You Are Needed Now By Our Immigrant Neighbors



Immigrant communities, both those who have arrived in the U.S. and those that are arriving at our borders are being let down by our federal legislators.

- On one hand, proposals are being circulated that would virtually eliminate pathways to humanitarian protection or extend Title 42-style expulsions for two years except with even fewer protections and no exemption for unaccompanied children. Together these render an asylum system out of alignment with our Unitarian Universalists values
- On the other hand, negotiations for bi-partisan, bi-cameral legislation are languishing despite urgency as Afghan parole status will expire during the Summer of 2023.

But we can help our legislators meet the moment, and overcome the challenge.

Board Briefs

Board briefs from both May 2023 MPUUC Board meetings.

The board met on Tuesday, May 9, 2023, and on Tuesday, May 16, 2023.

- Approved spending the \$500 currently in Fellowship Budget by rolling it into the restricted Fellowship Fund.
- Approved accepting delegation of authority to approve operating expenses and reimbursements. The purpose of this is to increase clarity, speed, and efficiency of reimbursements while maintaining necessary oversight.
- Board Meeting
- Discussed the upcoming Annual Meeting, which will be on Sunday, June 4, 2023.
- Voted for Volunteer of the Year. Results will be announced at the Annual Meeting on June 4.
- Discussed potential candidates for the 2023-24 Board of Trustees, assigned board members to reach out to those members, and discussed the results. Additional outreach is to be conducted this month to fill leadership positions.
- Scheduled an additional Board meeting for May 16, 2023 to further discuss leadership positions and the 2023-24 budget.
- Approved special summer collections for June (Sandwich Squad), July (Esthetics), and August (Fellowship).
- Discussed Widening the Circle to reach out to our own congregation to enable growth, and to light a fire under people to get them to say yes to leadership roles. Noted that establishing diversity is real work, and that we are a real voice, an antidote to those who are trying to submerge diversity.
- Approved a budget to present to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on June 4.


The next board meeting will be via Zoom on Tuesday, June 13 at 6:30 pm.


