Dear Sandra,

The world is turning a corner. While I hope we never forget the hard-won wisdom that Covid brought, we are moving into a time where the deeply human need to personally connect is rising, not waning. Covid's necessary control over us was powerful. Instructive. Even defining. And it's ending.

I say that with some gladness because it has been the ENTIRE time I have been with you. Covid was officially declared the week after I did my pre-candidating service for the Search Team. When I first met most of you it was almost entirely quarantined to Zoom – except the brief drive-by wave in the parking lot.



The beginnings of ministry are powerful, prophetic and visionary times when, in our excitement, we get to imagine what we'll do together. Covid took that from us. I'm not saying we didn't do the best we could at building connection and trust. And I know we used the time to innovate and meet many challenges that social distancing required. But it wasn't the same as being together. Celebrating in the same room. I grieve not having that. I really want a do-over.

In only a little over 6 weeks, I will go on sabbatical. I know!!! Right?!? A sabbatical?!? Right now?!? Enduring a sabbatical can feel like a Covid extension. But I invite us into a new frame: this is the do-over that re-schedules the exciting beginning we never had.

We've done really good work the last three years – not what we thought we'd do, but good nonetheless. We kept people safe, we re-evaluated, re-designed, re-grouped and recommitted to our future. A sabbatical is intentional time to take what we've learned and make the best use of it for a new beginning.

In the weeks ahead, you will hear more about the incredible planning and preparation that has gone into making this sabbatical a renaissance – not a penance. It is a time where new learning meets new dreams and begins building a new, more powerful ministry. Stay tuned

JUSTICE CORNER

Write to President Biden

The initiative set up by Texas Governor Greg Abbott known as Operation Lone Star (OLS) has been impacting asylum seekers at the Texas-Mexico Border. OLS has imposed cruel, inhumane, and deadly treatment in the execution of its official mandate "to combat the smuggling of people and drugs into Texas."

Recent reporting has drawn attention back to OLS, with stories about:

- 1. Migrant children being pushed into the Rio Grande and other migrants denied water.
- 2. The opening of a jail facility for migrant women, as arrests increase under OLS driven by a reliance on misdemeanor and trespassing charges
- 3. The apparent death of migrants due to one of the newly installed "barrier buoys"; and,
- 4. Reports about Texas troopers separating families.

The Biden administration must do more to prevent migrant arrests, mistreatment, and family separation occurring under OLS.

Let us urge President Biden and his administration to do more in challenging Operation Lone Star.

UUSJ Immigration Action Team

Right now, asylum seekers are forced to comply with unnecessarily long waiting periods before they are able to legally work in the United States. Without the ability to work, people seeking asylum are deprived of the right to earn an income and support themselves and their families.

Please consider writing to your member of Congress and ask them to support the Asylum Seeker Work Authorization Act of 2023 (H.R. 1325). If passed, this legislation would shorten the waiting periods and make it easier for asylum seekers to obtain a work permit and contribute to their communities.

Write to President Biden

WILL YOU SIGN A PETITION FOR THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT??

The ERA passed Congress with the needed 2/3rd vote of the United States House and Senate as well as the legislatures of the needed 38 states.

Congress must immediately recognize the Equal Rights Amendment and pass the following United States House and Senate resolutions:

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that notwithstanding any time limit contained in House Joint Resolution 208, 92nd Congress, as agreed to in the Senate on March 22, 1972, the article of amendment proposed to the States in that joint resolution is valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution, having been ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States.

Learn more about the history of the ratification process, why the ERA must be recognized by Congress as ratified; and why the ERA is still needed to guarantee equal rights to all.

Anti-Racism Anti-Oppression Committee (ARO) Recommendations

Earlier this spring at a rally for trans students

in Louisville, KY, a young nonbinary student spoke out to the crowd of supporters: "At my school, we have a 'no bullying rule.' SB 150 means that students like me are being bullied by the state!"



Right now, we're working at multiple levels to

stand with trans kids and fight the bullies in Kentucky. At the local level, we're **pressuring school boards in Louisville** and in **Ashland** to stop the enforcement of SB 150. At the state level, we're mobilizing SURJ members across the country for the governor's race to not only protect trans kids in Kentucky, but to ensure another state doesn't fall to a far right GOP takeover, which would be terrible for Kentuckians, and dangerous for all of us.

Nearly everyone knows and loves someone who is trans. So many of us are queer folks who grew up in places that were inhospitable to our identities. This year, we have the opportunity to stand with trans students in Kentucky and put people in office who are committed to supporting them, not threatening their existence.

Join SURJ this week to keep Democrat Governor Andy Beshear in office as an act of solidarity with trans students. We know one elected official isn't going to bring about a queer rights agenda, but keeping this office out of the hands of people of people like Robby Mills, GOP candidate for lieutenant governor, who has authored anti-trans legislation and been publicly vitriolic towards trans kids, is one right next step for Kentucky and for all of us.

Board Briefs

Board briefs for July 18, 2023 board meeting:

- This board meeting was conducted jointly by Suzette Takei, out-going board president, and Beth Schaefer, new board president.
- Unanimously approved a two-year lease agreement with FUMC for the period beginning July 1, 2023. The rent for the 2024-2025 year, which begins July 1, 2024, will increase by no more than the annual Social Security cost-of-living increase for the year, but will be capped at 2.5%.
- Email accounts and google groups for officers have been updated to be used by current board.
- Unanimously approved the Consumables Charter put forth by Steve Wallcave to allow all event planners to inventory, coordinate and appropriately shop for paper plates, napkins, etc.
- The fall equinox festival put on by the Tri-City Interfaith Council will be held at MPUUC on September 23.
- Discussion of possible dates for the Stewardship events for MPUUC for the 2023-2024 year: Canvass, boutique, auction. Agreed that the canvass must begin about March 15- April 1 in order to collect pledges and plan next year's budget. Several proposals for which months to schedule the boutique and auction. This will be discussed with past leaders of these events and voted on at next board meeting,
