Dear Sandra,

I'm writing here to tell you why you should come to the Diwali dinner / potluck this Saturday night at Mission Peak. In order to do that, let me tell you a little bit about me. My journey into celebrating this holiday begins with a holiday you are perhaps familiar with: Christmas.

When my partner Ajit and I first got together I was surprised to see how disinterested he was in celebrating Christmas. This was challenging for me: I was raised in a family that did not celebrate any of the holidays, so when I left that religion as a teenager I made it my mission to pull every drop of goodness from birthdays



made it my mission to pull every drop of goodness from birthdays and holidays, making up for lost time. My partner and I settled on a few agreements that would help us enjoy these holidays: we would cook a dinner with our extended family on Christmas and we would mark Diwali with a party with friends. The details have changed over the years but these two holidays remain important in the life of our family.

Diwali (pronounced dee-VAL-i), the Festival of Lights, is a holiday celebrated by many people all over the globe, most of whom live in India. In Sanskrit the name means "row of lights", referring to the tradition of lighting rows of small candles called diyas (pronounced DEE-as, like the Spanish word dia but with an "s" at the end). Diwali has various origin stories but they all generally follow a theme of good winning over evil. It comes in October or November on the new moon, hence the need for lots of light.

Like any good holiday it includes a meal with loved ones. This is where YOU come in. This Saturday night Mission Peak will host a dinner / potluck to mark Diwali. You are invited to dress up (or come in comfy clothes), to bring a dish to share (or give the gift of coming early to setup or staying late to cleanup), to paint a diya you can take home (or enjoy watching others paint), to help color in the giant rangoli we'll draw on the sidewalk out front of Cole Hall (which signifies this place as a spot for the gods to bring good luck and abundance in the new year ahead). Sometime between dinner and dessert / art project, we'll offer a short pooja, a kind of prayer sung to the gods. Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth, is the most common god to pray to on Diwali but we have chosen a Ganesha pooja, the god known for removing obstacles. We'll have the words printed out for any who want to sing along and invite you to join in this short ritual in whatever way feels right for

If this sounds like an event you would enjoy I hope you'll come! **RSVP is required** by Friday at 5pm, so we can be sure to order the right amount of food and have enough diyas for anyone who wants one. If you own or can borrow South Asian clothes you are

most welcome to wear them. I may have some to offer on loan- come early to shop:)

As always, reach out to me if you have any thoughts, ideas or questions. I hope to see you Saturday. Happy Diwali!

Mission Peak Votes to Support Reparations

There was a congregational meeting after the service on October 29 to vote on making a public endorsement of reparations for African Americans. At the meeting, the wording of the proposed statement was changed slightly to: "We endorse the overall efforts of the California Reparations Task Force to support reparations for African Americans." The final vote of those present in person and on zoom was: 24 yes; 0 no; 1 abstain. Because the wording of the statement was changed during the meeting, absentee ballots could not be included in the final vote. The news of this public endorsement by MPUUC has been sent to the California Reparations Task Force, which gratefully received it.

Board Briefs

Board Briefs from October 2023 MPUUC Board meeting.

The board met on Tuesday, October 11, 2023.

- ❖ Paul Clifford represented the Committee on Ministry to report on the results of the leadership survey.
- ♦ Breeze Charter discussion with DeAnna Alm; the board voted unanimously to accept it as edited. A statement of policy will be created and added.
- ❖ There will be a congregational meeting after the service on 10/29/2023 to vote on making the public statement: "We endorse the overall efforts of the California Reparations Task Force to study reparations for African Americans."
- Rev. Greg presented a new announcement policy for WotP. The board voted unanimously to accept it.
- The annual congregational meeting will be held on June 9, 2024.
