This is Alan Davis, on behalf of the Committee on Ministry. During Rev Greg's sabbatical, we are acting as the Sabbatical Committee, supporting Rev Jim during his three month tenure. I would like to thank everyone who participated in, or just listened to, the meeting we held after the service on November 19. We were trying to assess how the Sabbatical had been going during the first month, to determine if something might need to be fixed. We are happy to report that everyone expressed approval of Rev Jim, and that the Sabbatical was proceeding as well as they had hoped.

There were some minor issues brought up which we hope to address during the remaining month. We noticed that coordination had become more difficult, because there was no one (i.e. Rev Greg) who met



regularly with all parties. Some people suggested that the contact information for Rev Jim should be posted when the Joys and Concerns segment finishes, when he invites people who might have private issues. We also heard people say that services had been running long, although I think this might be a problem that has predated the Sabbatical.

The Committee on Ministry will continue to work with Rev Jim to monitor the ministry of the congregation, although one of our members, Paul Clifford, will be away until February.

## Anti-Racism Anti-Oppression Committee (ARO) Recommendations

## **SURJ (Show Up for Racial Justice)**

#### **Show Up for our Partners' Long Term Vision**

Our partners are leading with vision and breaking ground, investing in the space, people, and strategy required to build a humane society that will support their communities to thrive after centuries of racism.

- TGI Justice Project (TGIJP) secured a permanent home in San Francisco this year one that will hold their long-term vision of a Black Trans Cultural Center and political home for TGIJP members within the city they helped build.
- Sogorea Te' Land Trust is growing their rematriation work in Lisjan territory, returning to the cultural knowledge and practices that were lost in colonization. In partnership with Movement Generation, 43 acres of land in the unceded Bay Miwok territory of the San Francisco East Bay Area were returned to Indigenous care earlier this year.
- Initiate Justice, Ella Baker Center, and Californians United for a Responsible Budget are working strategically on securing long-term change through legislative

action. In 2024, our partners will be supporting bills that will help establish polling centers in county jails, allow incarcerated people in California prisons to vote, and engage youth facing restitution in restorative justice, community service, and employment. All this, while steadily working on closing California prisons.






