Greetings and happy holiday wishes to all of you, no matter how you celebrate the special days of winter and the transition into a new year!

I'm your President, Beth Schaefer. Looking back at the past six months, I'm pleased to report that your board of trustees – with the help of every single volunteer in the congregation – has strived to do its very best to guide and support several events and movements this year. By way of a few (probably not all – forgive me!) examples: We've supported and learned through Rev. Greg's sabbatical; welcomed and collaborated with our dear friend, Rev. Jim; we held a fun and financially successful auction; welcomed several new members;



continued our popular hybrid services; wrote letters to influence key elections; and we endorsed the California Reparations Task Force. We've had numerous festive and educational events organized by Ariel, and Von has brought new light to our choir. Now, as we celebrate Christmas and the New Year, we're looking forward, and plan to adopt some new projects during the second six months of our tenure. I want to take this opportunity to let you know about a couple of things we, your board, are envisioning and supporting for the coming year.

One exciting opportunity is that we will get to accompany another immigrant – Patrick Hebbart, a refugee from Nicaragua – as he seeks asylum in the United States and works toward becoming a U.S. citizen, employed, with emotionally supportive friends and family. Meredith Miller led us brilliantly through a similar process with our friend Sergio in recent years and she and Paul Clifford are very generously planning to do this again. More volunteers are welcome, says Meredith. Contact her about what you can do. We're fortunate to be given this opportunity to make a real difference in the world of immigration in our country, one person at a time.

Another project that we plan to get up and running again soon is becoming a Welcoming Congregation. This is a specific designation from the UUA indicating that we are knowledgeable, emotionally aware and active in the lives of LGBTQ+ folks so that we may better welcome and support them in our congregation. Mission Peak was an early adopter

of this program when it was created several years ago, but our membership has lapsed. Michelle Wallace is looking into what actions we must take so we may once again proudly carry this designation and become an ever more open, caring place. This too is a gift: to have the chance to try to make a positive difference in the lives of fabulous, but often oppressed, folks in our community. Contact Michelle to learn more or help out.
