### Information About Proposed Amendments to Article 2 of the UUA Bylaws

The process to propose amendments to the proposed Article 2 of the UUA's Bylaws is ending on February 1. There are 5 proposed amendments and none of them yet have the required number (15) of proposing congregations to be accepted for a vote at the General Assembly this June.

The proposals are described in detail **here**. Here is a summary:

- 1. Equity: Wording change adding "inherent worthy" to the Equity value.
- 2. Peace as a UU Value. This adds an additional value to the 6 already proposed
- 3. Equity "calls us to listen, understand, respect, and respond." Wording change.
- 4. Adds "Reason" to the description of "search for truth and meaning".
- 5. Current Principles as Preamble to new Article 2

#### A Year to Live - A 12 Month Course in Courageous Living

This year long course led by Rev. Greg and Terri King will meet once per month and is based on the book, 'A Year to Live,' by Stephen Levine. Using reading, reflection, spiritual practice and small group discussion, we will look to death as a spiritual teacher. Contrary to our largely death-denying culture, we will seek out the lessons death is constantly offering about living an inspired and courageously well-lived life.

This year-long course will meet via Zoom. Our first meeting will be 7:00 pm on Thursday January 25 and we will meet at 7:00 pm on the 4th Thursday of the month thereafter. #### We're planting a native plant garden!

Have you noticed how great the garden bed on the west side of Cole Hall is looking? MPUUC families came together last month to sheet mulch what was a barren, weedy plot. It got covered with living compost

which will help attract earthworms and other invertebrates that will loosen the soil. It was then covered with a layer of cardboard to block the light to smother any weeds and finally a layer of bark mulch to keep the lower layers moist and looking beautiful. Friday, January 19 • 7:30 – 8:30 am Human Billboard: Reimagine Public Safety





### Pacific Western Regional Assembly: Registration Opens January 4! Mark your calendars for April 19-20, 2024!



#### **Board Briefs**

Board briefs from December 2023 MPUUC Board meeting.

The board met on Wednesday, December 13, 2023.

 The Board voted to accompany Patrick Hebbart from Nicaragua through his asylum process. The first step in this process will be to assist Patrick in obtaining a work permit.



- The Board voted to approve several proposals concerning the investment of MPUUC funds, including moving some funds to CDs in the SRI Credit Union for better interest returns.
- The Board discussed what we need to do to renew our official designation by the UUA as a Welcoming Congregation. The Board affirmed that more important than simply being reinstated was to craft the opportunity to update and deepen the congregation's awareness and understanding of current concerns and issues facing the LGBTQ+ community.

The next board meeting will be via Zoom on Tuesday, January 16, 2024 at 7 pm.
