

Dear Sandra,

It is such a delight to be back with you. I found sabbatical to be exciting, informative, humbling and fun. I did come down with Covid toward the end and am still working my way toward full health. But seeing you again is an incredible uplift.

Some have commented that my beard is longer. I keep hoping it brings – at least infers – wisdom. But it probably just invites comparisons to Rip Van Winkle. In some ways, however, it seems appropriate. I do feel older, and I'm noticing a few more of the limits that time imposes. But the comparison seems apt partly for the way I've noticed you have changed.

In the Committee on Ministery's (CoM's) Congregational Conversation after the Jan. 21st Sunday's service it was pointed out that there is a new confidence at MPUUC. Some of this may stem from Rev. Jim's excellent ministry and many people's sense



Rev. Jim's excellent ministry and many people's sense of accomplishment – or relief – at 'surviving' the sabbatical. But there are other things that make me believe it's more than that. There are candles, now, in Joys and Concerns. And several leadership proposals have been made and affirmed (supporting CA reparations, accompanying Patrick in his bid for asylum, the Youth Voter Movement as a recipient of Share the Plate).

In Sunday's conversation, I mentioned that when I first arrived at MPUUC, I sometimes felt like the congregation was hesitant to act or, when it did, it re-acted from individual imperatives. But these recent actions seem more considered and cohesive, creative, coordinated and collaborative. It felt like there may be many more good things on the horizon for MPUUC. Indeed, we ended the meeting by challenging Mission Peak to imagine the outcome(s) of this new show of confidence.

We asked you to imagine that a year from now you look down at a local or regional paper (the Patch, the East Bay Times, the San Jose Mercury News) and on the front page an article jumps out. It's an article on Mission Peak! And recent community events we were instrumental in bringing to life. It has a picture. And as you begin to read, you smile. And you feel some of the pride that you've noticed has been building up over months – and even years. Then, halfway through the article, you see your name mentioned and a quote

from you about the events, how they came to be and what they mean to the community and beyond.

What the CoM and I were asking you to imagine was, 'what ground-breaking, community-changing' event is ahead for Mission Peak'? What great gift do we have within us that is eye-opening? Hoped for? Worth doing?

I believe we are confident enough to imagine it. And bold enough to begin manifesting it. So what is it? CoM will reconvene in late March to hold our 4th and final Conversation. In that conversation, we hope to bring that idea to consciousness. And then begin to bring that consciousness to reality.

It's good to be back.
