Dear Sandra,

I am Kathi Bayne. I have been a member of MIssion Peak UU congregation for more than 5 years. Recently, I had the privilege of speaking at our MPUU canvas event where I discussed how much anti-racist antidepression group (ARO) means to me and to Mission Peak. This committee has given me a chance to practice my social justice values in loving community.

A few years ago, we participated in readings and sermons that demonstrated the multitude of ways in which African-Americans have been deprived of homeownership, and therefore the personal wealth and intergenerational wealth available to many Americans.



We diligently searched for an organization that is trying to rectify this wrong.

After a lot of searching, we found Community Housing Development Corporation of North Richmond. CHDC-NR is a black-led affordable housing developer in the wider San Francisco Bay Area, that is creating wealth in our communities through the Black Wealth Initiative by addressing systemic racism in the housing industry. CHDC has raised \$304,000 for Down Payment Assistance and \$28,000 for Homebuyer Education. Donations have helped supplied Housing to 31 families since December 2022.

Petition to Exonerate the Port Chicago 50

 In 1944, a Navy cargo vessel explosion at a Bay Area port killed hundreds of sailors, most of whom were Black due to the Navy's segregation. When many of the



surviving sailors protested the unsafe working conditions, they were threatened with death and then convicted of mutiny. They have since been recognized as heroes, having sparked the desegregation of the U.S. Navy and the beginnings of the civil rights movement. Sign this petition calling for full exoneration for the Port Chicago 50 to restore honor and justice to their legacies.

SURJ Bay Area's solidarity statement on Justice for Palestine

– Many of us are talking about Palestine, marching to demand an end to the war on Gaza and the West Bank, acting to end the Occupation. Outside Mission Peak


