

UU Oakland will be our host, we all will provide the food, fun, and fellowship.



Petition to Exonerate the Port Chicago 50

 In 1944, a Navy cargo vessel explosion at a Bay Area port killed hundreds of sailors, most of whom were Black due to the Navy's segregation. When many of the



surviving sailors protested the unsafe working conditions, they were threatened with death

and then convicted of mutiny. They have since been recognized as heroes, having sparked the desegregation of the U.S. Navy and the beginnings of the civil rights movement. Sign this petition calling for full exoneration for the Port Chicago 50 to restore honor and justice to their legacies.

SURJ Bay Area's solidarity statement on Justice for Palestine

– Many of us are talking about Palestine, marching to demand an end to the war on Gaza and the West Bank, acting to end the Occupation. This is a good time to remind ourselves why we are acting together and to reread the SURJ BA solidarity statement on Justice for Palestine that was written collectively and released last spring.
