Dear Sandra.

This Saturday marks the 25th anniversary of taking my vows of ordination. Though I have changed greatly, I remember the day clearly. Standing in front of family and friends at the UU congregation of Toronto where I served my internship. Receiving the charge to the minister where Rev. Dr. Donna Morrison Reed called me away from, 'your inkling to try and be perfect...





...Dare to be human instead. Make mistakes. Learn. Repair. Measure yourself by how well you connect with people rather than how much you impress them.'

The Ordination Committee gave me a stole and reminded me that 'each time I put it on I was exercising a privilege requiring sensitivity, reverence, love without judgment, and constantly checking your privilege and your assumptions.'

This came while other charges still rang in my ears. From the Ministerial Fellowship Committee who, five months earlier, called me into the room to inform me they were granting me Preliminary Fellowship – BUT – with the counsel / admonition: YOU ARE NOT DONE YET!!!

At the end of my ordination ceremony I spoke my vows: 'With honor and humility I take up this ministry to which you have ordained me.'

You, as members of this Mission Peak community also celebrate a significant milestone with promise at the heart of it. May 2nd will mark 30 years since you came together – promising each other to show up and care; to raise children with love; to respond to conflict with open-minds and open-hearts; to respond to the unfairness around you with the commitment to love and justice you carried within you.

Many of you probably wouldn't recognize the people who made the original promise 30 years ago (even those who are still here, might not be recognized in pictures). But everyone who joins Mission Peak takes up the collective and evolving promise of this community: To love beyond belief and to make ourselves and the world the better for it.

My ministry was not always what I imagined it would be. There were times I felt

proud of the way I exercised the power I had been given. But there were times I made mistakes. I was not always as courageous as I thought I would be. I learned many more lessons from hindsight than the foresight which would have been better. On occasion, I hurt people. Where I could, I have sought repair and reconciliation. Made amends. I worked hard — especially in my denominational service — to remember that ministers are part of the 'learning tradition' rather than the 'learned tradition.'

We are all works in progress. But it's worthwhile to remember, the promise to which we pledge ourselves – that promise that we made (and that was made with us) all those years ago – was called forth and carried out by people who loved us, believed in us, held a vision for us and gave us something worthwhile to try and live up to.

As I remember all that, I just wanted to say how much I love you and how grateful I am that you are part of a promise that still lives in my heart.





#### Outside Mission Peak


