Topic: Time in a Bottle

Have you ever walked into a room and stopped because you can't recall why you wanted to go there? When I volunteered to write this introduction, I titled it "Time in a Bottle". We had recently had the Canvass Celebration, which included photos from events over the course of Mission Peak's 30 years. Perhaps I intended a commentary on our upcoming anniversary? Was



I going to muse on our challenges and accomplishments as a Beloved Community?

Then I took a trip with my family to Italy. 30 years is a flash in time, in Italy. Pompeii was a town since at least 424 BC, when it was buried by the eruption of Vesuvuis in 79 AD, and visitors walk through its excavations in 2024. Venice, a city-state, founded in the 5th century AD, by the 7th century had a participatory democracy that eventually included a Grand Council of 2000 elected representatives, but in 1797 was 'conquered' by Napoleon, then ceded to Austria and not until the Italian Republic was formed in 1866 did it escape Austrian control. The incredibly beautiful mosaic marble floors of the Vatican palaces, St. Peters and the Sistine Chapel, created by Renaissance masters are made of marble 'repurposed' from the Roman palaces on Palentine Hill, or state buildings in the Forum built there since 200 BC. As everyone does, we gaped with open-mouth in the Sistine Chapel above which sails the incredible ceiling, frescoed by Michelangelo for 4 years, 1508 -1511. There are layers, upon layers, upon layers of human history everywhere you look.

In the "bottle" of our Mission Peak, we have worked to create order and functions that support the operation of the community; we have created and learned rituals that bind us together to comfort one another in times of sorrow and to celebrate happy events and build fellowship; we share our searches for meaning and spiritual grace; we care for one another's children and families; we sometimes fail and then try new ways of being together, in community. Sometimes we hurt one another. More often, we strive for ways to be together with kindness, with consideration, with music, with food, with care. We work in many ways to improve the world and make it a better place for those who have less than we do and to be good stewards of the

precious resources of nature. We have only been working on this project for 30 years, it is still under construction. Cheers to another 30 years of making Beloved Community together here at Mission Peak.


