Blame

In the course of life it is important to understand why specific bad things have happened. This leads to the assignment of "blame". While blame is a useful concept, it is easily and frequently misused. One common error is to assume that if



blame can be placed on one person, or one small group, that means others are innocent. This is especially used to conclude oneself is innocent. But this does not follow from logic, and frequently both, or all, parties can properly receive blame. Another common misuse of blame goes the opposite direction, spreading it more widely than is fair, often blaming an entire ethnic group or nation for the misdeeds of some. Finally, is often erroneously assigned even when everyone has been doing their best. We will explore examples of these errors, and contemplate how to resist the frequent temptation to fix blame inappropriately.

Music of Brahms and the Schumanns



JUSTICE CORNER

We celebrated reintroduction of the Fair Representation Act (FRA) (<u>H.R. 7740</u>) this Spring by Representatives Don Beyer (VA-8) and Jamie Raskin (MD-8). FRA would require ranked-choice voting for the House of



Representatives, with multi-member House districts in more populous states, and end gerrymandering. End gerrymandering!

Tell your House Member to cosponsor FRA!

Passage would:

- Transform our political system, creating a more inclusive and deliberative government that respects and empowers all voices.
- Facilitate fair partisan and racial representation in Congress regardless of how lines are drawn in districts.
- Stop gerrymandering, making more congressional districts competitive, and encouraging candidates to reach beyond their base (<u>Pew</u>).
- Achieve accountability and competition in general elections instead of just primaries. 85% of U.S. House districts are safe for one party (<u>USA Today</u>).


Anti-Racism Anti-Oppression Committee (ARO) Recommendations
