Hello.

I am the affiliated community minister at Mission Peak with a mental health ministry. But, I am also a member of Mission Peak and in that capacity I have been active with the Anti Racism and Oppression committee (ARO). One of the projects of the ARO committee is to identify candidate organizations for our monthly share-the-plate offerings. This month we have chosen to support the Sunnyhills Neighborhood Association's Juneteenth celebration. As you will read below, Sunnyhills is in Milpitas and we celebrated Juneteenth with them last year.



I'd like to suggest that you consider joining the ARO committee. We meet twice a month and have been quite active in the last year or two. Here are some of our accomplishments:

Education: Every month there was one worship service that focused on anti-racism and anti-oppression; We held workshops on micro-aggressions with the goal of having 10%-20% of the congregation committed to interrupting micro-aggressions when they hear them.

Action: We made congregational reparations donations to Amah Mutsun (focus on Indigenous Americans) and the Community Housing Development Corporation (focus on Black and Latino Americans); We attended a Northern California Tribal Pow Wow and, along with San Jose and Hayward UUs, helped in a booth focusing on the Amah Mutsun Land Trust; Kathi Baynes' submission of a modification to the draft Article II proposal was one of 5 that were approved at General Assembly 2023.

Culture shift: The workshop on micro-aggressions is focused on culture shift.



Earth Bill - Force of Nature

The Earth Act to Stop Climate Pollution by 2030 (H.R. 598), popularly known as the "Earth Bill," focuses on electricity, cars, and food as industries in which Americans support change—most Americans agree that our electricity should be renewable, our cars electric, and our food should be produced using healthy practices.

Let's make noteworthy progress toward sustainability by 2030. As the Center for Biological Diversity reports in "<u>Out Polluting Progress</u>," under the current approach, it won't happen.

We Need the Environmental Justice for All Act

Take Action: **Environmental Justice for All**

Congress should pass the A. Donald McEachin Environmental Justice for All Act of 2023 (<u>H.R.1705</u>, <u>S.919</u>). They should act on "the moral principle that all people have the right to pure air, clean water, and an environment that enriches life." <u>Use our poster at church</u>.
