My name is Kathi Bayne. I am a member of MPUUC's ARO (Antiracism Anti-oppression group) Juneteenth (also known as Jubilee, Freedom Day, and Independence Day) is the celebration of freedom for African American enslaved people in the US. It is a time for family and friends to get together to rejoice in resilience, love of family, and love of community.

It is my pleasure to welcome you, your family, and your friends to Mission Peak UU's Juneteenth Celebration Picnic. Sunday morning worship service will be at Lake Elizabeth Park (**NOT Cole Hall**) June 16, 2024, at 10:00 AM.



We were able to procure a lovely spot, Lions 1, which is near the boat house and an easy walk from the parking area (map and directions below).

Also, we are planning something different this year. Rev. Greg and Ariel (Dir. of Multigenerational Community Building) will lead worship service and children's service in the park. Our worship hosts plan to set up laptops so that our Zoom attendees can join us.

Please consider bringing friends. Fremont Council Member Thersa Cox will be there to celebrate with us. It will be so exciting to celebrate our first MPUUC open air service in the chapel of nature at Lake Elizabeth. I hope you can make it.

Needed items

Please consider bringing chairs and tents for service.

Safety

We will do our best to ensure social distancing for those who would like to participate but maintain their distance for safety or comfort. A GREEN necklace indicates that you're comfortable with people getting close and possibly giving you a hug. A YELLOW necklace will suggest no direct contact but it's OK to get as close as 4-6 feet. A RED necklace tells others to maintain a distance of 6 feet or more if they are not in you cohort. We will offer color coded dots and name tags as well.

We are asking that we all to do our best to observe the indicators and the wishes of fellow congregants. People are welcome to wear masks and maintain whatever social distance makes them comfortable.

Singing and dancing together in the park will be encouraged for those who are inclined.

Food




Bay Area UU Fellowship Opportunities
