





Vote Forward curates lists of Democratic voters in key swing states, and of American citizens abroad. We never ask people to vote for any specific candidates or issues—just to participate in the election. We invite you to join us in this civic engagement effort, and for the fellowship we find by doing this important work together.

We have no external funding source for this effort. Your generosity in the past covered most of the cost of stamps so far, but we have 21 weeks of voter outreach remaining. We will buy as many stamps as we can before the July cost increase, and additional supplies as needed. We appreciate all of your contributions to this important outreach effort.

Midweek Discussion Group



Each visiting congregation will need to bring folding tables for serving food (card tables will work fine). Questions: text 510-295-7832 (Jay)


