Dear Sandra,

I won't try to sugar-coat my feelings for you or pretend everything is fine. My heart is too broken and I am too scared to do that. So, excuse me if I don't mince words. As Lutheran prison pastor, Nadia Bolz-Weber said in a post this morning, "I just can't blow sunshine up anyone's butt today, Lord, so I ask that you send us what we really need, okay? Please!"

But what I will do is share that the very first thing my mind turned to last night when my heart was breaking about the election results was you. Mission Peak is a fiercely loving community. For the past year, I have watched you show up for letter writing, make phone calls and donate generously to candidates in key races. It is impossible to put so much love and hold so much hope and not be devastated by what feels like widespread support for



be devastated by what feels like widespread support for hate, misogyny and xenophobia. So, before I go on, let me pause and just say, 'I love you' and 'I am proud of you,' and 'thank you' for being the kind of community built around high ideals. Seeing your commitment – especially through the hard times – means everything to me.

It's also important to say that as painful as last night's election results are for many of us, we need to be aware they land more catastrophically for some who identify as targets of increased persecution or reduced support. In the days ahead, it will be important to provide careful attention and support to those most susceptible to practices of violence and harm.

I know that so many things feel under siege or on fire right now. But I want you to know I continue to believe in democracy. I continue to believe in the power of love to transform injustice and the magic of compassionate community to rebuild broken hearts. I know these things are true from watching you.

But I also know that this may be the work of a lifetime. We can bend the arc toward justice but it may take awhile. And we won't do it on our own. Communities and coalitions dedicated to love for the long haul is what bends the arc.

Like you, I have been part of this great election push for the last couple years. That it has turned out the way it has breaks my heart. I cannot continue even one more step without a little solace and lamentation and the ability to look into your faces and feel the love at the heart of our shared faith. I cannot continue without you.

I hope you will consider coming to tomorrow night's vigil at Cole Hall (or, online virtually). And I hope you will reach out and bring someone you know who could use some encouragement. In the coming weeks and months, lean into this community as a circle of support. Don't try to do this alone. You – and the work we do together – is too important.


These family homes ensure more tightly knit communities, providing a sacred and shared space, inviting all to Encuentro La Milpa, or "enter the cornfield."

In the words of our partner, the land and homes are like a cornfield space "where the dreams of the family, of the community organization, are woven; where lived reality is addressed: problems and concerns, challenges, and hopes." La Milpa is "the people's struggle against extractive projects, against agroindustry, against invasive products. La Milpa means a political fight to make us people in freedom."

The 2024-25 UU Common Read is ready for you!

With this year's kit of Common Read resource materials, we are pleased and excited to invite Unitarian Universalists into conversation transgender and nonbinary people—and their partners, parents, children, siblings, and chosen family members —whose interviews and portraits fill the Skinner House book, Authentic Selves: Celebrating the Lives of Transgender and Nonbinary People and Their Families.

The subjects of Authentic Selvesshare their own stories, speaking from different stages of life, different regions of the country, different faith traditions, and different places on the rainbow spectrum of gender identity. Their book invites readers into their lives'



revelations, challenges, joys, and networks of support.

The team who created this resource kit included UU religious educators with personal life stories outside the gender binary. Working from the heart, we followed the lead of *Authentic Selves*, centering the voices and perspectives of trans and nonbinary people and their families in all the discussion materials. On the UU Common Read landing page, you'll find a Discussion Guide for a Mixed Group (all gender identities), a Cohort Discussion Guide (transgender and nonbinary participants only), a Youth Group Discussion Guide, and a Workshop for Parents and Caregivers who love and care for transgender and nonbinary children or youth.
