Dear Sandra.

Hello, Mission Peakers! If you have been grappling with some very painful feelings and worries lately, you're definitely not alone. One of the things that has intensely frustrated me since the election is my feeling of helplessness around all the things I anticipate happening to my country soon. I'm thinking, "I've got to do something to help! But what can I do that actually matters? How can I support the things I love? And what can I do that would grow and sustain me personally while I make a difference in the world?"



In my internal strife, it seemed serendipitous that I was recently introduced to the concept of "community

organizing." (Thank you for that great sermon, Rev. Greg!) I had never understood the term before — I just knew Barack Obama did community organizing in Chicago before he became a senator. But the term means more than just making a list and going to a march. It encompasses the way a group (say, MPUUC) can choose an issue to work on (say, racism, climate change, science denial, women's rights), learn about it, then join forces with other organizations that are doing work that aligns with the beliefs and dreams we hold for Mission Peak. By banding together, we're multiplying our power.

Community organizing works. For many years the status quo has been dramatically changed by community organizing – from suffragism to civil rights, from marriage equality to Black Lives Matter. This is powerful stuff.

There is help to be had too. For example, there are several national organizations that assist with community organizing for many causes. We would have support.

On Action Sunday some of us began to learn about this process of community organizing and how and why Mission Peak could get involved in some important cause. We'd be able to develop strategic partnerships – with other change-makers, other powerful groups, and with our legislature. Those relationships would make a bigger difference in our world and, at the same time, serve some of Mission Peak's own deeper missions – more justice work, more relationship-building within and outside the congregation, and more members, since we'd be interacting regularly

with like-minded people.

I'm excited about this new, effective approach to action – to making our voices heard and truly changing some of this very difficult political situation. We're holding a Community Organizing meeting after the service on December 15. Join us! Learn about what we do next – one thing this may include is interviewing each other to develop our congregation's "narrative" about who we are and where we want to go from here. Soon each of us, and Mission Peak as a whole, will begin to look at what issues are painful for us and which issues excite each of us as we work our way forward.

I fervently hope you will give serious thought to how you can help prepare Mission Peak for these exciting and powerful actions in the world – actions that support us in our personal growth and in nurturing MPUUC itself. I'm all in – are you?



JUSTICE CORNER

How we understand the rule of law might be at stake in the lame-duck

In the last four years, great strides have been made to improve our judiciary by confirming judicial nominees dedicated to civil and human rights. We must continue building a federal judiciary that lives up to its promise of equal justice and neutral judging.



The Senate should ensure all eligible, qualified, pending judicial nominees are confirmed by the end of the year. With **16 lifetime nominees** pending on the floor right now, and more to be reported out of Committee this week and in coming weeks, from the **roster of 67**, the Senate needs to be intentional and diligent.

Kathi, tell your Senators that they must confirm every pending judicial nominee in the remaining weeks of the 118th Congress. This must be done expeditiously, and the Senate must stay in to get it done.

Our democracy depends on qualified, fair-minded judges committed to upholding the rights of all of us, as well as neutral judging traditions. Please act now.

The Spirit of Love has a home in you. May we all see that love in you and let our hearts become mirrors for the compassion at your core.


The Spirit of Justice has a home in you. May we light our wicks from one another until we are all aflame, until we burn out every prejudice we carry in these bones.


Making announcements
