- What would make for a great all-ages, community service event?
- How to make a positive impact in the life of any one unhoused person?
- What kind of outreach event could appeal to families and adults?

These are the aims of MPUUC's upcoming *community service day event* on Monday, January 20th. From 10am-12 noon Cole Hall will be set up with tables for any person in the tri-city area (and beyond) to come learn about these issues and put together one care package, to be shared with a



person who is unhoused. When attendees arrive they'll receive a bag and a check-list. As they visit each table, picking up items to complete the package, they'll also learn one fact about homelessness, including the surprising truth about why housing insecurity persists in our region (hint: it isn't actually primarily caused by addiction or mental health challenges, as many incorrectly assume).

The board has earmarked funds to make this project a wonderful success and you are invited to contribute as well. There are several ways you could help:

- Show up that day to put together a care package!
- Volunteer that day (we need baked goods, help staffing the tables, greeters, etc) sign up HERE
- Sign up to contribute supplies to offset the cost of this event (same link as bullet above)
- Take a handful of fliers from the Welcome Table this Sunday (or print your own) and post in prominent places
- Invite friends and neighbors to come!

Not only is **Monday, January 20th Martin Luther King Jr Day,** which makes it an ideal day to be of service to others, it's also inauguration day. Midweek Discussion Group



JUSTICE CORNER


This #InternationalHumanRightsDay, Unitarian Universalists for Social Justice are in solidarity with the 21 young people leading America's Climate Case - Juliana v. US! For nearly ten years, the Juliana 21 have fought for their day in court to secure fundamental climate rights for future generations. And for nearly ten years, the U.S. Government has wielded its power and misused the law to silence them - all while becoming the top producer of fossil fuels in the world.

InIn our constitutional democracy, the courts exist to protect peoples' fundamental rights from government overreach - especially when children's rights to life and physical safety are violated by their own government.

Yesterday, the Juliana 21 filed a Petition for Certiorari at the U.S. Supreme Court. They have the right to access justice. SCOTUS, let the youth be heard!
