Do you have plans for this Monday, **Martin Luther King Jr Day**?

President Reagan signed the King Holiday Bill into law in 1983, 15 years after civil rights activists first began to call for such a day of remembrance. It was changed to the King Holiday and Service Act by President Clinton in 1994, making it the only federal holiday designated as a national day of service to encourage all Americans to volunteer and improve their communities.

What better way to honor the legacy of Dr. King by participating in the community service event that MPUUC, co-sponsored by Tri City Interfaith Council, will be hosting this coming Monday, January 20th. We'll be in Cole Hall from 10am-12noon, creating care packages for our unhoused neighbors and learning



about housing insecurity in all of its complexities. Helping to distribute supplies and talk through these complexities will be representatives from ABODE, Fremont for Everyone, Compassionate Fremont and a group from Mission San Jose HS called Poverty Patchup. There is no need to pre-register, anyone who can get here is welcome to help make a care package. Please consider inviting a friend or neighbor who may need to feel uplifted by being in community with other caring people. Remember that Monday is also inauguration day.

Don't wait until the last minute to come as supplies may run out. We'll have hot coffee and pastries, as well.


In the words of the great Congressman John Lewis, make this MLK Day "a day on, not a day off".

LOVE AT THE CENTER BOOK DISCUSSION – JANUARY 26 After Worship

In June of this past year (2024) the <u>UUA underwent a democratic process to update Article II</u>: how we describe Unitarian Universalism's unique approach to religion. The <u>Seven Principles and Purposes</u>, along with the <u>Six Sources of Wisdom</u> were largely incorporated into a new motif of six shared values which we covenant to uphold with Love at the Center. Given how attached many were to the 7 principles, many congregations required deep reflection to understand what it means to put Love at the Center. From August – December of this past year, MPUUC presented summaries of 17 of the 26 essays contained in the book, <u>Love at the Center</u> describing what UUs mean when we say we put Love at the Center. On January 26, after Sunday Worship, MPUUC will hold a discussion of the book. You can click in the title above to order your own copy.

AWARE-LA offers a workshop series on building white anti-racist practice and community in an intensive 4-day institute designed specifically for white people. Through personal reflection, group dialogue, activities, and embodiment practices, this institute invites white people to explore:

- meanings of whiteness
- white privilege and multiple identities
- · addressing guilt and shame
- structural, institutional, and systemic racism
- anti-racist practice, identity, and community

Immigration Policy: Need for Shift in Values

We Americans are implementing a policy blocking and deporting millions of agricultural low-tech immigrants but, at the same time, increasing the number of high-tech-engineer immigrants.
