Outstanding Work, More Coming Soon

Greetings, Mission Peakers! I'm Beth Schaefer, your Board President, checking in about important work going on in the congregation and letting you know of a place where we hope to make a very big difference in the City of Fremont soon.

I'm very excited about the cluster of meaningful – and fun – events we've had recently! The two Lunch and Learn sessions that Rev. Greg has arranged have taught us about having meaningful, short, one-on-one conversations about what truly matters to other people – a key to Community Organizing – and we learned more about how to approach others and let them know about an important related event, the MLK Day of Service at Cole Hall. Fourteen purple-shirted MPUUCers went to the Irvington Farmers' Market last



weekend for our Action Sunday and they handed out over 150 flyers about the Day of Service held the next day, Monday, MLK Day, to prepare gift bags for unhoused people. This is tremendous participation with tremendous results!

The Day of Service had 175 attendees in Cole Hall! Six local groups that work with unhoused people were represented, hosting tables of items for the bags and letting folks about what their organizations do. The talking and networking flowed freely as individuals and families circulated to different tables to fill out a questionnaire and fill their bags with a thoughtful array of toiletries, snacks, warm socks and hats, and a hand-written note of encouragement. Those who completed the questionnaire teaching about relevant information received a cookie at the bake sale, and everyone was encouraged to take a filled bag or two to give to an unhoused person they know or encounter. While many participated in a Sandwich Squad, making sandwiches for the unhoused in the kitchen, lots of people lingered to socialize and watch the kids play afterward.

Ariel Smith-Iyer, our Director of Multigenerational Programming, did an incredible job of creating the Day of Service, including making contact with organizations we may want to collaborate with in the future. So many of us learned a great deal, felt good about doing something tangible to help our community, and had fun. Thank you, Ariel!

Meanwhile, there's also always more we can do to help. The next meeting of the Fremont City Council will be held on Tuesday, February 4, at 7pm. The Council will be voting on whether to make it legal for police to arrest people who are "camping" or living in a tent, RV or car in Fremont. This would mean that sleeping outside is a crime in the City of Fremont. MPUUC is strongly opposed to this measure that unfairly targets and criminalizes unhoused people, and many of us are planning to attend the meeting and to speak about how cruel and wrong we feel this action is. Please join us! You don't need to speak, but your very presence in the Council chambers, preferably in your purple t-shirt, will let the Council and the city as a whole know where MPUUC stands and that there are many people in Fremont who care about how unhoused people are treated here. Please plan to attend. Letters are very important too; information will be forthcoming about how and when to write to the Council and what best to say.

We're on a roll at MPUUC! Attend an event and join in making meaningful change in a world that needs it right now.

A Land In Search of Its Ancestors

In 2020, one of the initial intentions of the Mission Peak ARO Team (Anti-Racism, Anti-Oppression) was to offer a land acknowledgement at the beginning of our worship services. The purpose of Land Acknowledgments is to humbly recognize the impact that our settler-colonialist history has had on the people and the land. When we began the practice, we ran into a problem: it turned out to be a much harder task to actually identify which indiginous communities were the original and/or rightful heirs of this land. This service is about ARO's search to learn the truth about the original occupants of the land.

Rev. Greg Ward will lead the service and assisting will be Worship Associate Rev. Barbara Meyers. Erik Alm will be Worship Host. Peak Performers under the direction of Von Bringhurst will provide our music.

January Share the Plate - Muwekma Ohlone Tribe Inc.

We will be collecting through February 23.

The Muwekma are a landless tribe whose families enrolled with the Bureau of Indian Affairs from 1928-1971 and attended Indian boarding schools in the 1930s-40s. Scattered throughout the Bay Area, they lacked communal spaces to preserve their traditions, language, and dances, which spread to other communities during the 1870s. The tribe is now revitalizing their culture through workshops on language, songs, traditions, dances, regalia, native plant restoration, and cultivation. Our donations will support these efforts.

LOVE AT THE CENTER BOOK DISCUSSION – This Sunday After Worship

In June of this past year (2024) the <u>UUA underwent a democratic process to update Article II</u>: how we describe Unitarian Universalism's unique approach to religion. The <u>Seven Principles and Purposes</u>, along with the <u>Six Sources of Wisdom</u> were largely incorporated into a new motif of six shared values which we covenant to uphold with Love at the Center. Given how attached many were to the 7 principles, many congregations required deep reflection to understand what it means to put Love at the Center. From August – December of this past year, MPUUC presented summaries of 17 of the 26 essays contained in the book, <u>Love at the Center</u> describing what UUs mean when we say we put Love at the Center. On January 26, after Sunday Worship, MPUUC will hold a discussion of the book. You can click in the title above to order your own copy.

If you weren't able to attend I invite you to picture Cole Hall with a horseshoe shape made of tables, each staffed by a local group already working to create solutions and offer care to those among us experiencing housing insecurity. Together we created 150 care packages, some of which attendees took with them to share with someone in the community that they meet, the rest were given to ABODE to share with the folks they offer services to.

We also hosted the MPUUC tradition of Sandwich Squad, making 100+ sandwiches which were shared with our partners, S.A.V.E. (Safe Alternatives to Violent Environments) and Second Chances Sobriety Homes.

The words most often offered to describe this event are "amazing" and "wonderful". It was a fabulous chance to be in multigenerational community with folks from across the Tri-City and a beautiful tribute to Dr. King on the holiday that bears his name. 

Anti-Racism Anti-Oppression Committee (ARO) Recommendations

2025 will see Donald Trump take office in a highly polarized nation where White Christian Nationalism holds significant influence over our shared political, religious, and cultural life. This is a pivotal time for people of faith to lead the charge in resisting White Christian Nationalism, and SURJ Faith is partnering with the Kairos Center for Religion, Rights, and Social Justice to gather faith communities for this important work.
