Dear Sandra.

I am Kathi Bayne, and I am a member of the Board.

Some time ago, I had joined the Mission Peak UU Congregation Outreach Committee. I was looking for reasons why people attend church and how to make us a more welcoming community.

I came across a Vanderbilt University study by Professor Marino Bruce, Associate Professor of Medicine, and Society. The review was titled "Worship is Good for your Health."

Their findings surprised me. Their conclusions were:

- 1. People who attend church (not people who have a faith but people who actually **attend** church) decrease their mortality by 55% or about 7-14 years compared to those who don't.
- 2. The increased life span was related specifically to **attending** some form of religious church, temple, synagogue, mosque, etc. It was a finding that was independent from belonging to a social community or social support group.
- 3. They surmised the likely reason for the association between church attendance and longevity was due to believing in, and caring about, something more than yourself.

Exploring improved health and longevity in association with spirituality, lead to my interest in Blue Zones. These are areas of the world where people regularly live longer and, most important, healthier than any other places in the world. A component in most of these societies is religious community.

One of these localities is the Loma Linda, California where Seventh Day Adventists make up much of the population. However, studies show that Seventh Day Adventists in areas other than Loma Linda also tend to live longer than their non-Seventh Day Adventist peers. Their religion focusses on healthy living and good works. This may have a lot to do

with the fact that the Seventh Day Adventist Church is growing significantly while many other churches are losing members.

As I continue to explore ways in which we can enhance our beloved community as well as reach out to the community around us, I find increasing evidence that being a healthy community makes us more attractive to ourselves and others. Therefore, we are trying to offer more healthy alternatives at MPUUC. For example, our very successful Lunch and Learn activities includes cookies or cake, but also, fresh fruit and healthy soups so people have choices.

When We Walk By





Board Briefs

Board briefs from February 18, 2025 MPUUC Board meeting.

The Board met on February 18, 2025

- MPUUC has taken action to support unhoused residents in Fremont in various ways including, written and spoken opposition to the City of
 - Fremont's proposed "Camping Ban" Ordinance (FMC Section 8.90), joined a community coalition "Coalition of the Caring" with Fremont For Everyone and other community faith groups and non-profit organizations, called a Congregational Meeting to vote on whether to become a plaintiff in a civil rights lawsuit against the City of Fremont for its proposed Ordinance.
- DeAnna Alm is the Canvass Chair. Canvass (our pledge process) begins March 9
 with a lunch at Cole Hall and a virtual Potluck on Monday, March 10 for Zooming
 members. The Treasurer uses Pledge information to create the Annual Budget that
 is voted on at the June 8th Annual Meeting.
- The Board is investigating one of its Restricted Funds, the Building Fund, to determine donors and a possible amendment to its purpose. If MPUUC members are interested contact Valerie Stewart at Valeriempuuc@gmail.com.
- The Board has entered into negotiations with Rev. Jim McKinley to serve as its Sabbatical Minister later this year from October to December, when Rev. Ward is on Sabbatical.
- The Board is looking for Members who would like to attend General Assembly -June 18-22- as a Delegate (it is possible to attend virtually). Contact President Beth Schaefer if you are interested.

The next board meeting will be via Zoom on Tuesday, April 22, 2025 at 7 pm.
