Hi folks,

I hope you are all as well as can be expected during these somewhat trying times. I'm pleased to report that our canvass leader Deanna Alm has collected nearly all expected pledges from members for the next fiscal year of 2025-26 (July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026) for MPUUC. If anybody hasn't made their pledge yet, we really need it as soon as possible for fiscal planning. As your treasurer, I incorporate the total pledges into a proposed budget for MPUUC for the fiscal year of 2025-26. I will discuss the budget with the MPUUC board and I expect that we will agree on a proposed budget. Then the MPUUC



congregation will vote on this proposed budget in the MPUUC annual meeting on June 8, 2025.

Based on current pledges, I expect a budget deficit for 2025-26 of \$25-30 K. We have unfortunately lost some members and their pledges this year due to relocation. While this deficit is somewhat disturbing, MPUUC does have savings to cover this deficit (thanks to generous donors in the past), and unplanned donations and new pledges during the year would preserve these savings. I also love seeing some new members who joined MPUUC this year!

MPUUC is a great place to see friends and support one another. I am also really excited about the social justice work that MPUUC is doing and the opportunity to learn and contribute to it. I think that MPUUC is becoming a community leader in Fremont and beyond to raise empathy for the unhoused, and I am happy to support Rev. Greg's and Ariel's leadership in this area. MPUUC is also doing great work to support local Native American groups and combat racism. I am a little sad to notice that this work is sorely needed these days.

- 1) <u>STAPLES</u> Recycling Services Program: School supplies: crayons, pens, pencils and colored pencils, markers, highlighters, rulers and drafting tools
- 2) <u>Smartwool</u> Second Cut Program: Clean socks, all brands, colors, sizes, and materials welcome (merino preferred). Single socks only. Do not roll or pair socks.

3) The Bra Recyclers:

Recycle your new or gently used clean regular bras, sports bras, and nursing bras.


