Dear Sandra.

Hi folks,

I hope you are all well. As your MPUUC treasurer, I'm pleased to report that we now have a proposed budget for FY 2025-26 that the MPUUC congregation will vote on in the MPUUC annual meeting on June 8, 2025.

Based on current pledges of \$238,304 plus matching funds of \$15,000 from some generous donors (thanks!), and some income from investments, we expect a budget deficit for 2025-26 of \$25,211. Total expenditures come to \$308,015. This reflects a budget with 3% cost-of-living increases for our hard working staff members — Rev. Greg, Ariel, Von, Sandra, Jordan (our



babysitter) and Mallory (our webmaster). We are quite fortunate to have such a good staff and to have the structure to continue making our congregation successful. The small 3% cost-of-living increase communicates to our staff that we acknowledge their efforts and want these efforts to continue. But also don't hesitate to thank them personally for a great congregational year!

I will be presenting more details about the 2025-26 budget in the MPUUC Annual Meeting on June 8, 2025. Before that, feel free to ask me any questions about how MPUUC operates and spends its budgeted funds throughout the year. Please remember that our fiscal year starts on July 1, 2025, so please fulfill your pledges for 2024-25 by that date if possible. Thanks for your contributions!

I feel quite blessed to be a part of our little community and thrilled to tilt against the windmills of cultural and technological trends that are causing us to become more individualistic and less socially oriented. We all have our individual activities – work, family, exercise, play, and entertainment, but it is great that we also find the time and energy for our social organization of MPUUC. I love seeing all of you on Sundays at Cole Hall or on Zoom. Listening to sermons, experiencing the worship ceremony, listening or playing music, conversing with you over coffee, and participating in social justice projects has become a nice part of my life over the last few years. But every community requires a

degree of organization and leaders. As Beth wrote in the Annual Meeting letter, we are still looking for someone to step up to be Board President for this year. And regardless of who steps up to take on this responsibility, the rest of us need to support that individual since it cannot be done alone.

SABBATICAL



MPUUC Community Garden

The MPUUC Community Garden beds are now ready for planting, and we probably should get some veggies in the ground right away. We have two beds on the north side, one on the south, and a long bed on the east.

This is not only a tremendous opportunity to infuse beauty and purpose to our campus, but to potentially provide food for lunch and learns as well as local residents of shelters and encampments who don't often get healthy fresh produce.

For now, I think we just need to see how much of the space folks want to plant. (Also, signing up for multiple sections is fine by me.)



Our immigrant neighbors in the Bay Area are facing new threats as they navigate an immigration system that is growing more dangerous every day. Bay Resistance is forming a group of volunteers to meet the requests of local immigration organizations who have asked for additional volunteers to be trained and ready to accompany adults and families to their scheduled



appointments and hearings with ICE and immigration offices. Join this training to understand the need and principles of immigration accompaniment and become part of Bay Resistance's volunteer accompaniment network.

Board briefs from March and April 2025 MPUUC Board meeting.

The Board met on March 25 and April 15 2025

March 25:

 The Board voted to become "fiscal sponsors" of the Tri-Cities Interfaith Council in order to collect their income and pay their bills from their account because they are not a 501(c)3 organization. This does not affect MPUUC finances in any way; Sandra will be paid by TCIC for her occasional work on this.



- A sliding scale of fees to be charged for using Worship Hosts who volunteer to do A/V work for outside requests such as memorials was established.
- MPUUC's delegates to the UUA General Assembly are Kathi Bayne and Beth Schaefer.
- Plans are being made for Rev. Jim McKinley's contract during Rev. Greg's sabbatical.
- Plans are underway for Action Sunday on April 13.

April 15:

- Treasurer Jay Steele is making preparations and adjustments to the 2025-26 annual budget as needed before it is voted upon by the Board next month.
- President Beth Schaefer is negotiating MPUUC's lease with FUMC for 2025-26.
- The Board is investigating who donated to the Building Fund created over 20 years ago. To release this unused, restricted fund for other uses, the preferences of donors who can be identified will be considered.
- More MPUUC t-shirts will be ordered since all we have left are very small and very large sizes.

The next board meeting will be via Zoom on Tuesday, June 17, 2025 at 7 pm.
