Greetings!

What I want to talk about in today's column is the theme of the month at Mission Peak UU which is, 'Building Belonging.' You're going to hear a bit about that theme in the next couple weeks as both Mark Rahman and I will share sermons that touch on the subject. Mark will talk about 'Whitesplaining to White People' on the 21st where he will explore how to identify who really needs support in this racially and politically divisive moment and how to offer that support. On the 28th, I will talk about 'This Superman Moment' where I try to understand what kind of Superhero calls us to be more kind – or 'Woke' – and what 'wokism' is really asking of us.)



But before I do any of that, I need to say how much it meant to me to get so much love and good wishes on my birthday yesterday. There were cards and calls and texts – as well as glimmers of love and appreciation dropped into so many ordinary conversations.

Now, I've been in this ministry business for long enough to know that I didn't suddenly figure out how to do things perfectly or finish the formula that always leaves everyone happy. The love that was sent my way came from a wide variety of people amidst a challenging and potentially polarizing moment in our community, our city and the world. Many of the people who expressed sincere care had, at least once, experienced disappointment or confusion with choices I made or conclusions I came to. But they confirmed the importance of my place in the community and in their heart. And THAT is what 'Building Belonging' means to me.

I don't expect the love and appreciation that came my way yesterday to be the only – or last, or final – word in the ongoing conversation that connects me in this beautiful and wild constellation of connections that makes up our world. But I do believe in the research of Marriage and Family Guru John Gottman who concluded that for any relationship to be sustainable over the long haul, there needs to be 5 positive interactions during conflict for every negative one.

I believe that this current administration with its self-absorbed power plays based on contempt, condemnation and uniting people through cancel culture will ultimately fail. Human beings may find short term motivation through common enemies. But, ultimately, we are creatures that are built from – and for – love. It is Love that reveals to us our true power. It is when we speak, share, show up and celebrate love – in at least a 5:1 ratio that we build the belonging that will sustain community. Thank you for reminding me once

again.



They are mostly sizes Small, X-Small and XX-Large.


They are a little darker purple color than the new T-shirts, but we will still look like one family.

We Denounce The High Court Ruling On Racial Profiling



This takes our republic back to the precipice of Jim Crow, in one step

WASHINGTON D.C. — On Monday, September 8, 2025, the U.S. Supreme Court released a ruling in Vasquez Perdomo v. Noem. The decision allows immigration agents to conduct roving immigration raids and stops, even when race is a central factor in their decision to detain someone. In effect, this ruling authorizes and normalizes racial profiling.

Further arguments on this case are expected, which could shape the future of constitutional protections for decades. In the meantime, this ruling permits the federal government to continue arrests and raids that violate the Constitution's foundational protections.

- The Board approved the Letter of Employment for Sabbatical Minister Jim McKinley who will hold that position from October 4, 2025, through December 7, 2025. The letter was sent to Rev. McKinley for his signature.
- The Board established a Search Team for a contract minister to serve at the time of Rev. Ward's retirement in June 2026. Jay Steele is scheduling a meeting with UUA Congregational Transitions Director Christine Purcell.
- Rev. Ward is attending a Zoom meeting with Attorney Anthony Prince regarding the status of the lawsuit against the City of Fremont regarding the "camping ban". No Amended Complaint was ever filed, naming Mission Peak as a plaintiff.
- MPUUC is purchasing a new multi-task color printer and an electronic keyboard for the use of the Music Committee and Music Director.
- The Board approved a new Budget category for funds for ASL Interpreter services.
