God is Betting on Us - Part III - This Superman Moment

In this concluding segment of the sermon trilogy, we will use one of the most iconic figures of American culture to help reveal evidence showing the ways society has slipped into unprecedented low in civility. MAGA critics pushed hard on the



claim that the new Superman movie is 'wokism'. But the real truth is we have simply allowed greed, selfishness and cruelty to become normalized - making kindness and decency seem odd or unusual. This is a sermon that asks us how we might restore 'truth, justice and the American Way.'

Ever Had trouble hearing the Sermon in Cole Hall?

I have exciting news to share! We have a new device in Cole Hall that streams audio directly to people's assistive listening devices (hearing aids, Cochlear implants) and/or earbuds. It has been a game changer for me being able to understand the sermon at services by removing the bad echoing in Cole Hall. It is an Auracast transmitter connected to our PA system.

Most people will connect to Cole Hall's Auracast stream using Auracast Assistant on their phone or hearing device. (I use the Auracast Assistant part of my Jabra hearing aid app).

I am happy to email with you about how your device may work with our system and have a partial list of compatible devices that work with Auracast. Please email me at wallcave@mpuuc.org. I will also be at Cole Hall before and after the service to answer your questions or help you connect on October 19.

Many modern assisted listening devices and earbuds are compatible with Auracast, although many may need a firmware update to take advantage of it. For definitive answers on whether your hearing aid or Cochlear implants are compatible with Auracast you may need talk to your hearing professional.

They are mostly sizes Small, X-Small and XX-Large.


They are a little darker purple color than the new T-shirts, but we will still look like one family.

JUSTICE CORNER

We Denounce The High Court Ruling On Racial Profiling



This takes our republic back to the precipice of Jim Crow, in one step

WASHINGTON D.C. — On Monday, September 8, 2025, the U.S. Supreme Court released a ruling in Vasquez Perdomo v. Noem. The decision allows immigration agents to conduct roving immigration raids and stops, even when race is a central factor in their decision to detain someone. In effect, this ruling authorizes and normalizes racial profiling.

Further arguments on this case are expected, which could shape the future of constitutional protections for decades. In the meantime, this ruling permits the federal government to continue arrests and raids that violate the Constitution's foundational protections.

- The Board approved the Letter of Employment for Sabbatical Minister Jim McKinley who will hold that position from October 4, 2025, through December 7, 2025. The letter was sent to Rev. McKinley for his signature.
- The Board established a Search Team for a contract minister to serve at the time of Rev. Ward's retirement in June 2026. Jay Steele is scheduling a meeting with UUA Congregational Transitions Director Christine Purcell.
- Rev. Ward is attending a Zoom meeting with Attorney Anthony Prince regarding the status of the lawsuit against the City of Fremont regarding the "camping ban". No Amended Complaint was ever filed, naming Mission Peak as a plaintiff.
- MPUUC is purchasing a new multi-task color printer and an electronic keyboard for the use of the Music Committee and Music Director.
- The Board approved a new Budget category for funds for ASL Interpreter services.
