From the scribblings I made on the pad beside me in the car, I can just make out that the clouds had covered the shining beauty of Mt. Shasta ceding the view to an uninterrupted horizon of trees, ridge line and sky. I noted that friends and dinner



were waiting. I said: It'll be good to arrive and even better to be together.

Yes, indeed. It's good to be here.

Hello Fellow MPUUC Members!

I am Mark Rahman, a member of the Board. We have now embarked on the process that leads to the new minister that will become *our* minister when Rev. Greg Ward retires. I will introduce the process which has some accelerated portions. The Board has created a task group whose mission is to recommend what form of minister selection format we should choose in the circumstances we find ourselves in. The group consists of myself, Valerie Stewart, Michelle Wallace and Drew Wilson. There are options as to what kind of hiring. There will not be a difference in the ministry after the hiring. The task group will select a method for hiring the minister and send that as their choice to the Board. The Board will say yay or nay to the method. If yay, then a search committee will be called,

hopefully we shall have sufficient volunteers. The search committee will take in information gleaned from three Congregational Conversational Meetings.

While that is happening, the search committee will also begin creating the story of MPUUC that will entice our very best possible candidate to fall in love with us. The story must also be honest about any warts you may feel need to be addressed. Finally, we announce the intention to hire to the UUA. There is a time line for all this and specifics as to what is included. Because time is limited, please be in touch with the task group, the Board and the search committee when constituted, with concerns, questions, advice and suggestions.

The first of the congregational meetings happens after service on October 12th. We will talk about our path forward as we select a minister in the post-Greg era. The task group will present their findings at the meeting. We, the Board and the Committee on Ministry, solicit your feedback at that time. We invite everyone's involvement in whatever manner you are able in our next steps. Being there and learning about the process will be helpful to all as the next Board meeting does not happen until the 14th. More information will follow between now and the 12th.



Ever Had trouble hearing the Sermon in Cole Hall?

I have exciting news to share! We have a new device in Cole Hall that streams audio directly to people's assistive listening devices (hearing aids, Cochlear implants) and/or earbuds. It has been a game changer for me being able to understand the sermon at services by removing the bad echoing in Cole Hall. It is an Auracast transmitter connected to our PA system.

Most people will connect to Cole Hall's Auracast stream using Auracast Assistant on their phone or hearing device. (I use the Auracast Assistant part of my Jabra hearing aid app).

I am happy to email with you about how your device may work with our system and have a partial list of compatible devices that work with Auracast. Please email me at wallcave@mpuuc.org. I will also be at Cole Hall before and after the service to answer your questions or help you connect on October 19.

Many modern assisted listening devices and earbuds are compatible with Auracast, although many may need a firmware update to take advantage of it. For definitive answers on whether your hearing aid or Cochlear implants are compatible with Auracast you may need talk to your hearing professional.

These are still available to anyone who wants them.


They are mostly sizes Small, X-Small and XX-Large.

JUSTICE CORNER

We Denounce The High Court Ruling On Racial Profiling



This takes our republic back to the precipice of Jim Crow, in one step

WASHINGTON D.C. — On Monday, September 8, 2025, the U.S. Supreme Court released a ruling in Vasquez Perdomo v. Noem. The decision allows immigration agents to conduct roving immigration raids and stops, even when race is a central factor in their decision to detain someone. In effect, this ruling authorizes and normalizes racial profiling.

Further arguments on this case are expected, which could shape the future of constitutional protections for decades. In the meantime, this ruling permits the federal government to continue arrests and raids that violate the Constitution's foundational protections.



- The Board approved the Letter of Employment for Sabbatical Minister Jim McKinley who will hold that position from October 4, 2025, through December 7, 2025. The letter was sent to Rev. McKinley for his signature.
- The Board established a Search Team for a contract minister to serve at the time of Rev. Ward's retirement in June 2026. Jay Steele is scheduling a meeting with UUA Congregational Transitions Director Christine Purcell.
- Rev. Ward is attending a Zoom meeting with Attorney Anthony Prince regarding the status of the lawsuit against the City of Fremont regarding the "camping ban". No Amended Complaint was ever filed, naming Mission Peak as a plaintiff.
- MPUUC is purchasing a new multi-task color printer and an electronic keyboard for the use of the Music Committee and Music Director.
- The Board approved a new Budget category for funds for ASL Interpreter services.
