Still, it is winter, and the weather has turned colder, and I am grateful that MPUUC is participating with the Methodist Congregation (FUMC) to host "Guests" from the Safe Parking Program (SPP). 16 people are participating now in this Fremont City program in which faith communities with property take turns allowing 15 vehicles to be parked on their property overnight, for a month at a time. This is one part of the City of Fremont's Homelessness Response Plan. FUMC offers breakfast and dinner for the SPP Guests in Rooms 7-8 in the Ockerman Building and MPUUC members can participate by offering a meal or attending one of the special events (see below).

This coming Sunday, here at Mission Peak we are taking up a SHARE THE PLATE collection to contribute to the fund for gas cards that will be offered as Christmas gifts to the Guests.

I can tell you from having dinner with SPP Guests Monday night that they are hardworking, funny, generous and still wondering how their lives will evolve from where they are now. 
