

These are crucial events in the lives of people we love that aren't covered in our operating budget. But they are essential in letting people who are struggling know they matter. Your generosity and participation with the Methodist Congregation (FUMC) as they hosted the Fremont Safe Parking Program guests in December has been outstanding! MPUUC folks have contributed meals and shared company with the SPP Guests and learned their stories. Becoming unhoused can happen to anyone, we have learned. Your generosity with our special collection on December 14th combined with the Methodist Congregation will provide each SPP Guest with a gift card for gasoline in the amount of \$100 each. We are "meeting the stranger" and opening our community to knowing all who live here.

As you know the Safe Parking Program is one aspect of the City of Fremont's Homelessness Response Plan. City Council member Kathy Kimberlin has organized community meetings to see that all aspects of the Plan become operational- with community support. 


Midweek Discussion Group

How To Have Courageous Conversations – In time for the holidays, IfNotNow has put together *A Guide for Discussing Israel/Palestine* at your dinner table. Especially geared for Jewish community members, the guide is also a useful tool for anyone to have courageous conversations about Palestine with family and friends.

Tell your Members of Congress to Condemn the Trump Administration's Anti-Immigrant Policies – The Trump administration is responding to the tragic attack on two National Guard troops by pursuing collective punishment against the most vulnerable in our communities to advance a racist and unconscionable anti-immigrant agenda. Trump has said he plans to expand his xenophobic travel ban to more than 30 countries, halt asylum

applications, and impose more restrictions on nationals of the existing 19 travel ban countries. Congress must stand against this hate-filled effort to scapegoat entire communities, including our Afghan and Somali neighbors who have become the focus of some of these most recent attacks.



Board Briefs

The Board met on December 9, 2025 via Zoom. Trustee At Large Michelle Wallace was absent due to health matters. The next Board meeting is scheduled for January 13, 2025 at 7:00 pm. via Zoom. All are welcome to attend.

1. The Board noted the conclusion of the Sabbatical period with the departure of Rev, Jim McKinley as of December 7th and the return of Rev. Greg Ward. Rev. Ward thanked MPUUC for the privileges and support that is the sabbatical period and plans to share insights and experiences in the coming months.
2. Finances: Currently the Budget has received 56% of its anticipated funding for the 25-26 year and expenses are only at 33%, which is a positive situation. There is still work being done to sort out the status of/access to the SRI CD accounts. Drew and Jay will work to get clarity.
3. The Ministerial Search Committee reported that the Congregational Profile is now accessible on the UUA website for minister candidates to review. The Search Committee will monitor the profile and report any new activity/developments to the Board and the Congregation.
4. MPUUC Policies Review: Board Policy 2. POLICIES requires a review for update every two years (last done fully in 2023.) The Board will meet in-person to review them after the Sunday Service January 4, 2026, in the MPUUC Office. All are welcome.
5. Updating the website. The Board is continuing to standardize the protocol to make updates to the website, so all important documents and recordings of Services are available there.
6. "Rites of Passage" a description of services available for MPUUC members and friends is under construction.
